Joseph Hensel has spent decades salvaging old patterns, parts, tools and machinery from local steel mills, coal mines, power plants and industrial facilities that he called on. He turns these items into art—tables, lights, clocks, designs to hang on walls—all evoking images of the past and paying tribute to those industries. He also creates pieces from documents obtained from Bethlehem Steel Corp. and U.S. Steel. All the pieces celebrate the accomplishments of Americans by preserving the tangible remnants of the great industrial past, and making them available for the future.
