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




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ABOUT THE ARTIST

Alexis Zovalovsky



Alexis Kovalovsky (formerly Sobecky) is a multidisciplinary artist and art educator based in western Pennsylvania. A lifelong creative, she has been immersed in drawing and painting since childhood, and in 2019, she expanded her practice to include copper—a medium that now plays a central role in her work.

Alexis is a graduate of Central Cambria High School. She went on

to earn a BFA from Slippery Rock University and an M.Ed. from Clemson University. She currently teaches high school art in the Armstrong School District, where she inspires young artists while continuing to develop her own studio practice.

Her artwork is rooted in a deep appreciation for nature and place. Through both copper and traditional media, Alexis captures the quiet beauty of everyday scenes—moments often overlooked, yet rich with meaning. Copper, in particular, allows her to emphasize the details of texture and form, bringing a tactile depth to her representations of the natural world.

The landscapes and subjects in her work are drawn from both her western Pennsylvania roots and her travels, reflecting a sense of connection to the places she's explored and the stories they hold.

Alexis lives east of Pittsburgh with her husband and son, where she continues to create work inspired by the world around her both near and far.
