- Campers must be signed in/checked in by a responsible adult, not dropped at the door. Parent Pick Up Cards are required for any adults to pick up campers.
- Campers should wear comfortable play clothes and shoes that can get messy. NO FLIP FLOPS!
- Sunscreen and insect repellent are strongly suggested and must be provided by the parents/guardians. CAC will not supply these items, and campers must be able to apply them independently.
- All campers **MUST** be fully potty trained in order to attend any camps at CACCC. *If a child has more than one isolated accident, CACCC reserves the right to remove the child and refuse their attendance for the remainder of camp with no refund.*
- Plan to pack a water bottle and non-refrigerated lunch/snack each day. Please refrain from including nuts in your child's lunch/snack! We remain nut free during camps in case of allergies.
- All camp staff have PA Clearances.



