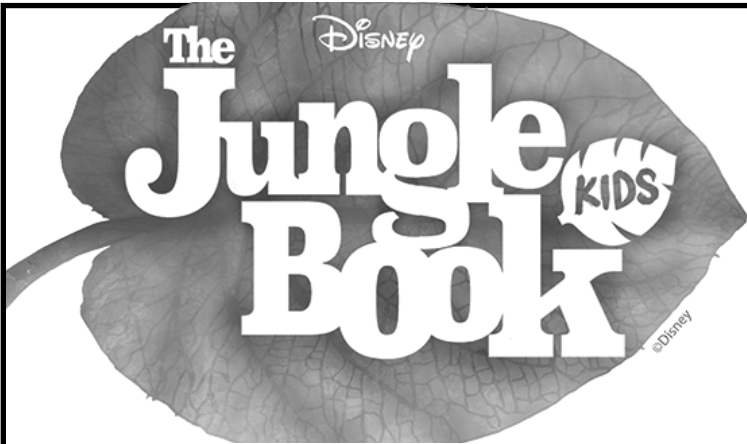

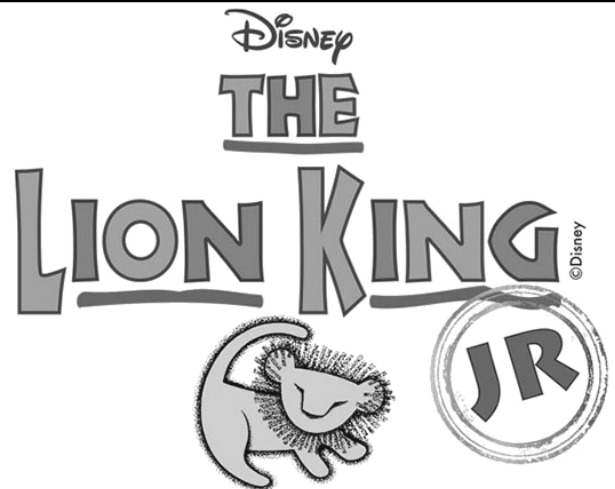

One track moves in a precise sideward direction and the other track moves in a precise forward and back direction. Cha Cha music crosses many genres and generations, from traditional Latin sounds to 70's, 80's, 90's, 2000's, and current music. (Dance partners can be provided for individual students.)

Interestingly, this dance works beautifully across many genres of Latin music, as well as country and classic rock.
