






Wilson Middle School

Wilson Middle is a public school located in Natick, MA, which is in a large suburb setting. The student population of Wilson Middle is 869.





Natick High School is ranked 59th within Massachusetts. Students have the opportunity to take Advanced Placement® coursework and exams. The AP® participation rate at Natick High School is 56%. The total minority enrollment is 24%. Natick High School is the only high school in the Natick Public Schools District.

Biking, Walking and Future Use

The Cochituate Rail Trail (CRT) is a multi-use trail that runs from the Village of Saxonville, Framingham to Natick Center. The total trail has a distance of just under 4 miles. The segment in Framingham was completed and paved as part of the first phase and in 2021 and the Natick segment is open for use. The current trail ends at Whitney Field, but plans are to finish the trail and have it extend to the MBTA commuter rail station in Natick Center by the end of 2024.

Much of the trail is quite scenic. Passing near streams and wetlands in Framingham (and, in the future, along the shores of Lake Cochituate in Natick), the trail is a beautiful park which provides valuable open space through heavily developed sections of Natick and Framingham. Due to its close proximity to office buildings, shopping centers, schools, and residential areas, it provides residents with an attractive alternative to driving. Once it is extended to the MBTA station, it will provide even greater transportation use.

The trail follows the former Saxonville Branch rail line southeast from Saxonville and will meet the active Boston-to-Worcester commuter line in Natick Center.

Cochituate State Park

Cochituate State Park's main feature is Lake Cochituate, which is made up of three linked ponds. However, the State Park has many uses:

Tony Anniballi Memorial Park

This park at Pegan Cove brings you into the woods but is only a stone's throw from downtown Natick. There are a variety of trails spread across this 22-acre park and is popular throughout all of the seasons.

Mass Audubon's Broadmoor Wildlife Sanctuary

An expansive retreat along Indian Brook and the Charles River, Broadmoor is teeming with wildlife: dragonflies, turtles otters, and more than 175 species of birds. Easy-to-moderate well-groomed trails lead you through the shade of mature woodlands into open fields and along the edges of streams, ponds, and marshland
