

Growing up in rural western Pennsylvania left an impression on my sense of how I look at the world. It seems as far back as I can remember I have had an excitement and a need to respond when confronted with a sublime landscape. The accumulation of time spent outdoors and an artist mother who primed my sense of awareness has created the foundation of why I paint today.





Today, there will be times when I see sunlight filtered through a misty woods or shadows being cast across the yard and I will have that strange, familiar feeling. Going back to childhood, I remember how warm spring evenings filled with springtime smells, sounds and light would invoke a rather nervous, restless feeling. Essentially, it is a feeling that I need to capture this. I need to grab someone and say "LOOK AT THIS! Isn't it amazing?" If I paint it, I relieve this urge. In some ways, it is a very simple, primitive response. I'm sure it doesn't fit in with today's concept-heavy art world. What is my concept? That thing is my concept-that tree, that shadow, that LIGHT.

So I paint. The wonder of it is after 40 years or so, I am still excited, inspired and curious. That is a blessing.
