Artist Statement

Spirals, circles, abstract designs, textures and figures have always intrigued me. I use bright acrylic colors, make marks and use elements of collage to bring excitement to a work of art.

Exploring mixed media and beautiful colors is comparable to indulging in good dark chocolate.

I learned how to collage from Vae Hamilton who sadly died last year. I love the effect that collage gives a painting either as a piece of art or used in mixed media. Using your own painted or gelli-plate printed papers adds to the excitement! Using copies of your own photographs as a collage element is also wonderful. Unsplash is an excellent resource for copyright free images.

Biography

Marion Cloaninger is best known for her colorful acrylic mixed media paintings. Her process involves creating layers, applied in non-traditional ways, using acrylic paint, papers, monoprints and found collage elements.

Her subjects range from vivid abstracts to semi-abstracts of landscapes, flowers and figures. Her approach is to explore, take risks and be open to the unexpected.

Topic

A demonstration of how to collage papers and images to a substrate using gel medium. Further development of a collage painting will be done on a dried substrate.

Learning Objectives

To learn how to adhere papers to a substrate and develop into a finished piece of art using acrylic paint and/or markers. Use of mark making and stencils will be demonstrated.

- Painted or Gelli-Plate printed papers.
- Golden Satin soft gel medium [thinned with water] or matte medium.
- Old credit card, dough scrapper [my preference] and flat color shaper.
- Acrylic paint.
- Water proof markers.

- Pencils and/or ink pens.

- Stencils and make up sponges.
- Water bucket.
- Brushes.
