

Electrolysis is Permanent, but it is a gradual process where the hairs will first become thinner, finer and weaker before they stop growing permanently. Being consistent and following the treatment plan will allow you to achieve the quickest results. Electrolysis averages approximately 2 years to be permanent.

### First 3 Mouths

Not all your hair is visible at the same time. It will take 3 months to clear all the hairs within one growing cycle. This stage usually requires weekly appointments. We want to treat the hairs when they are in their growing stage.

# 3-6 Mouths

Most of the hair we treated in the first hair cycle will begin to grow back after 8-13 weeks. The hairs will grow back with a weaker root. We will re-treat all the regrowth again. Weekly appointments may still be needed for large areas.

# 6-12 Mouths

If full clearance has been achieved twice, this stage is when we will start to notice true results. Thinner hairs have been permanently destroyed. Any remaining hairs will be thinner, finer and less noticeable. We will continue to treat the regrowth but our appointments will be shorter and less frequent. (Every 2-6 weeks)

### 12-24 Mouths

If consistent in reaching full clearances. approximately 50% or more of your hair will be permanently removed by this stage. Remaining hairs will be very thin. We will continue treating regrowth as needed, with appointments becoming even shorter and even less frequent. (Every 6-12 weeks)

# 24+ Months

Ideally your Electrolysis will be permanent at the 2 year mark. Failure to follow the treatment plan or delaying appointments when you have active regrowth will result in the process taking longer to reach permanent results.







Your hair root has been directly targeted with an electrical current designed to kill the hair cells that cause hair growth...
This is going to cause irritation and discomfort to your skin.
The area may be red, inflamed and may feel hot for a few days.

#### After Care

To cleanse - Witch Hazel or a light cleanser 1x per day To soothe and refresh - Aloe Vera Redness and/or Swelling - Ice Scabbing - Polysporin 2x3 times a day until healed Break outs - Tea Tree Oil Once Per Day

# Possible Temporary Side Effects

-Scabs are your body's way of protecting you from bacteria, infection and debris. The higher the setting required, the more likely you will experience scabbing. It can take 1-2 weeks for scabbing to subside.

#### Please Do Not

- -Do not touch or pick the area or you may increase your chances of infection.
- -Do not use tanning beds or go into the direct sunlight until the area is healed
- -Do not use harsh products/cleansers or apply make up to the area for 72 hours
- -Avoid hot tubs and swimming pools for 72 hours or until the area is healed
- -Do not tweeze/wax the area. Shaving is ok up to 3 days before your appointment

### Rare but Possible Side Effects

- -Infection is unlikely but please visit your doctor should signs of infection develop within 24 hours after your appointment.
- -Bruising is unlikely but should one occur, it will resolve on it's own.
- -Hyperpigmentation (darkening of the skin) can occur if you go into the sun or use a tanning bed before the area is fully healed.
