

Here are some supplies that I would suggest/recommend

Most can be purchased at Amazon and Hobby Lobby. I suggest using a coupon at Hobby Lobby. You can usually get a 40% off coupon at <https://www.hobbylobby.com/>

Watercolor Paper --- Arches, Cold-Pressed, 140#



Hobby Lobby has been stocking this pad for us . . .
Good paper is key to success in learning watercolor. This is excellent paper, but a little pricey, so a good use of the coupon. Don't skimp here. It will make it more of a challenge to learn technique with cheap papers. You should expect to pay about \$25 for a pad of 12 sheets sized at 9 x 12.

Also Hobby Lobby -- The MasterTouch brushes are available in the **teal-blue** packaging as shown in this photo.

The packaging is this color and marked as Watercolor & Acrylic. This one is a number 4 Round -- a good starter, along with a number 8 round

They are on sale for 50% every few weeks, but not expensive either way.

Since they are water-based, they are still OK when they dry up . . . just apply water
So, they can last on the pallet for many months, even a year or two.



Pallet . . . I suggest using a white foam or paper plate to begin

But, IF you are at Hobby Lobby for other stuff, this is one is very nice. It will keep your paint reasonably dry and has lots of places for pigments.
