





The Legacy of the Reformation: Teaching the Faith

On the last Sunday of October, our church - along with many Lutheran Churches around the world - will celebrate the Reformation. On October 31, 1517, Martin Luther posted his 95 Theses on the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany. The 95 Theses were intended to begin a scholarly debate about certain practices within the Church of his day. This act began a Reformation within the Church that eventually led to the plethora of Protestant denominations that we have

today. While that act began the Reformation, Martin Luther had a significant influence on other aspects of life in the church and world.

Take, for instance, the Bible you have at home or on your phone.

The year was 1521, and Luther had been "kidnapped" by Elector Frederick the Wise in order to protect him. Martin Luther had been branded as a heretic and outlaw by the Church because of the things he believed and taught. In order to keep him safe, Frederick hid him in the Wartburg Castle.

While he was at Wartburg, Martin Luther began the task of translating the New Testament from the original Greek language into the German language. He desired that all German people could read the Bible, rather than just the educated class who read the Latin translation. Luther's work of translating the New Testament into German was completed in 1522, and the first edition quickly sold out. He then began the task of translating the Old Testament from Hebrew into German.

Luther was not content with just having a German Bible available to the people; he also wanted the commoners to learn how to read and understand it. He urged the princes of the land to establish schools in order to teach children how to read so that they, too, could learn and study the Bible. Many historians point to this as the beginning of public education. The German princes opened schools to teach children how to read so that they could learn about God's grace and Jesus' great love.

He also wrote both the *Small Catechism* (1529), which was intended to help parents teach the faith to their children, as well as the *Large Catechism* (1530), which Luther wrote to make sure that the pastors understood what the Bible taught.

Martin Luther wanted people to spend time in the Word, and to teach the faith to children and adults alike. We continue this legacy today with Lutheran day schools, Sunday School and Adult Bible Studies, Vacation Bible School, confirmation and adult information classes. Our own Wee Disciples Pre-School and Childcare are part of that tradition of teaching the faith to children. Missionaries across the world bring God's Word to all the peoples

in their own languages. Chaplains share the Holy Scriptures with members of the Armed Forces and their families. But anyone can share God's love, mercy and grace as found in His Word with the people in their lives.

God has revealed Himself to us in the writings of Holy Scripture. He has shown us His grace and mercy, and has taught us about His Son, Jesus Christ. In these Words, He grants us forgiveness, life and salvation. Spend time reading the Bible and rejoice in your salvation.
