CONCERNING THE LORD'S SUPPER

The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor or an usher.

FOR THOSE with YOUNG CHILDREN...

In Matthew 19, Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me and do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of heaven." Jesus wants your little ones present with Him during our worship service. So do we.

While children may often fidget and fuss during the service, we consider the noise that they make to be a form of sacred music – the song of God's children learning more and more what it means to be Christians. And it is for this reason that we invite the children to stay with us for the entire service. We also suggest the following steps to help them learn.

- Sit toward the front where it is easier for them to see what is happening.
- Sing the liturgy and hymns, boldly. The more engaged you are, the more quickly they will learn to follow along.
- Explain to them what is happening throughout the service.

If you feel that your children are being too disruptive, please feel free to sit in the Narthex. There are also activity books and "quiet time' bags in the back for your children. Ask an Elder or usher for assistance.

Finally, if your attempt to get through the service today was a disaster, come back next week. The more consistently you show up, the easier it will get. And, whenever you come, just like Christ, we will always be overjoyed to have you and your little ones with us.

Tri-Parish Parsonage Update A Difficult Beginning and Task

Last year you learned the heavy news that a faithful servant of Christ, Rev. John Vallie, was no longer able to serve his congregations in Plentywood, Wolf Point, and Glasgow.

The three congregations Pastor Vallie served encompass a vast region — by area, roughly one-tenth of the state. These congregations have worked together to support a pastor before — and they desire to do so again. But to call a new pastor, they needed something essential: a parsonage.

At the convention, the District took up this challenge. We committed to redirecting 5% of our synodical giving toward the purchase of a parsonage (Resolution 1-02).

Good News

Even before an official request for assistance:

- Three Montana congregations each gave \$20,000
- A South Dakota congregation heard of the struggle and sent \$35,000
- Another Montana congregation has pledged \$10,000 (and is raising more)
- The Office of National Mission awarded a \$25,000 grant That's over \$130,000 raised before we could even make a formal

request!

And the blessings keep coming!

A family in Plentywood reached

A family in Plentywood reached out to offer a home — less than a block from the church — before listing it on the market. A full inspection revealed around \$40,000 in needed repairs, but the home was offered below market value. The congregations made an offer, and after some negotiating, it was accepted. With repairs included (some that might be made by Lutherans around the state willing to assist), the total cost of the new parsonage will be just

over \$200,000. The congregations are now one step closer to being able to call and welcome a new pastor.

God Is at Work

I waited to send this update until some of these pieces fell into place, but now I share it so you can **rejoice** with us. This is the Lord's doing — and it's beautiful in our eyes.

Thank you for being part of this story — for praying, encouraging, and supporting these congregations. Thank you especially to the Rev. Bruce Zagel, Rev. Howard Schreibeis, and Rev. David Behm, who have stepped in to preach, teach, and serve in this time of transition.

A Call to Prayer

The devil delights in division and in silencing the Word. But Christ is not weak or poor — He is mighty and generous and He is with us. He has united us in His truth and called us to bear one another's burdens. You have done just that. Thank you.

- **Thanking God** for what He has already done in Plentywood, Wolf Point, and Glasgow.

- **Asking** the Lord to raise up a pastor to live in this parsonage and serve His people in these communities.
