





Merry Christmas!

It was 9 pm on Christmas night, the first of our married life. The manager of the apartment building in St Louis was taking down the Christmas decorations. "What are you doing?" I asked him. "Christmas is over," was his response. "The decorations

have been up since before Thanksgiving. That's more than long enough."

That seems to be the mindset of many big box stores and home centers, although the dates keep creeping earlier every year. Christmas displays have been up since October, often juxtaposing inflatable ghosts, turkeys, nativity scenes and reindeer. Stores began celebrating the *12 Days of Christmas* on December 12th or 13th as a countdown to the big day. Online retailers counted down the final day to order for "Guaranteed Delivery by Christmas Eve." Although those guarantees aren't really guaranteed anymore. And then, just as quickly as the displays appeared, the clearance sales began. Christmas gear only has value until the 23rd, and it costs far too much to store the surplus until the next year.

The world has it all wrong. The Season of Christmas doesn't begin in October or November, and the First Day of Christmas isn't in mid-December. It's not a countdown to Christmas at all; it's a commencement of a 12-day celebration that begins on December 25th and ends on January 5th, just in time for *The Epiphany of Our Lord* on January 6th.

So let me say it again, all the more cheerful: **Merry Christmas! Christ has come for us!** During the Season of Advent - those four weeks before Christmas - the Church looks forward to the coming of our Savior. Jesus came as the Baby of Bethlehem. He comes to us in Word and Sacraments to grant us faith and forgiveness. And "He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead," as we confess in the Creeds. Advent is that time when we wait expectantly for Jesus to come and save us.

The Season of Epiphany follows Christmas and lasts until Ash Wednesday. This is a time for the Church to look for the revelation of who Jesus is and what He has done for us. During the Season of Epiphany, we hear of the Magi who followed the star to worship Jesus. We hear about Jesus' Baptism, where the Holy Spirit descends upon Jesus in the form of a dove, and the voice of the Father speaks from heaven: "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased," revealing Jesus as the son of God. And hear of Jesus' first miracle at the Wedding Feast at Cana, when Jesus turned water into wine, showing that Jesus has power even over creation.

But until January 6th, say it loud and say it with gusto: **Merry Christmas!** Merry it is because the Lord has come. He has pierced through the darkness and brokenness of this world with His eternal light. He has come to be our Savior.

And if you want, you can leave your Christmas decorations up as long as you'd like.

May the Peace of Christ lighten your life!
