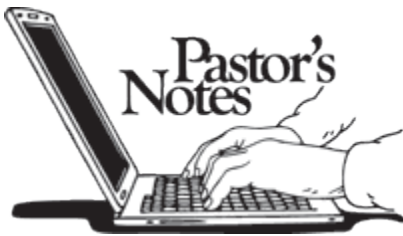

What is Worship: The Season of Lent

Last Wednesday evening, we gathered together to celebrate Ash Wednesday. Ashes from burnt palm branches were mixed with a little olive oil and placed on our heads in the sign of a cross. We heard those words first spoken by God to Adam after he first sinned: “You are dust, and to dust you shall return.” Because of sin - both Adam’s first sin, and our continual sin - we will all die, and our bodies will return to the dust of the earth until Christ comes again to raise us from the dead.

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the Season of Lent. For 40 days, the Church bids us reflect on our sin and our need for a Savior. As we contemplate our sin, it leads us to confess our sins to God. As we learn in the Small Catechism on Confession, “Confession has two parts: First, that we confess our sins, and second, that we receive absolution, that is, forgiveness, from the pastor as from God Himself, not doubting, but firmly believing that by it our sins are forgiven before God in heaven.”

Some people choose to give something up for the Season of Lent; others make a concerted effort to add Bible Study and devotions to their daily routine. We also have weekly Midweek Services on Wednesday evenings. Our Soup Supper will begin at 6:00 pm, with church continuing at 7:00 pm each Wednesday. The theme for this year is ***Promised Treasures***. There is more information about the Midweek theme below.

Our worship services also take on a more solemn tone. Last Sunday, we celebrated the Transfiguration of our Lord. Our final hymn was *Alleluia, Song of Gladness! (LSB 417)*. In that hymn, we sang,

*“Alleluia cannot always / Be our song while here below;
Alleluia, our transgressions / Make us for awhile forgo;
For the solemn time is coming / When our tears for sin must flow.”*

The word, “Alleluia,” is a joyful exclamation that means “Praise be to God!” During this Season, we “bury” the Alleluia. We won’t sing or speak it again in our services until we celebrate the joy of the Resurrection of our Lord on Easter Sunday. We also will omit the Gloria in Excelsis during Lent. As we noted last month, the color of the Season of Lent is Purple, which reminds us of Jesus’ suffering for us.

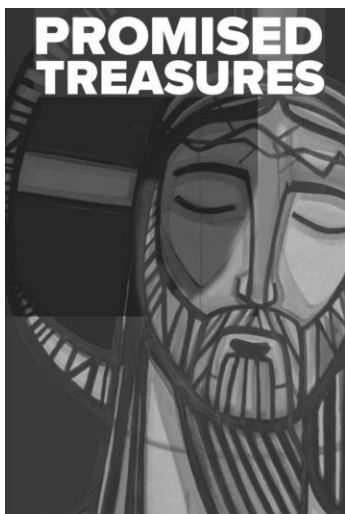
Spend time this Lenten Season contemplating your sin and need for a Savior. Read the Bible on a daily basis. Come to worship to receive His good gifts of Word and Sacrament. Study God’s Word and prepare for the Lord’s Resurrection.

PROMISED TREASURES

*“Therefore every scribe
who has been trained for the kingdom of heaven
is like a master of a house,
who brings out of his treasure
what is new and what is old.”*

Matthew 13:52



This Lenten season, we have a fresh opportunity to embrace God’s amazing love for us, His baptized children, in new ways. St. Paul clearly says that *“faith comes from hearing”* (Romans 10:17), but the Gospel is also communicated through the physical senses of sight, smell, touch, and taste. Jesus mentions that a good teacher not only brings out new treasures but reminds people of old and rich treasures as well (see Matthew 13:52). So, each Wednesday in Lent, we will take a weekly journey to concretely see, smell, touch, and taste a number of biblical elements. Our Lenten series is called *Promised Treasures*. Just as Israel wandered through the wilderness under Moses for forty years, awaiting the Promised Land, we await heaven in the wilderness of this life. Life as exiles in the wilderness of this world is not easy and pain-free. In this vale of tears, we await our real home, the new promised land of heaven. Until we enter our eternal promised land, however, the Lord calls us to be His light in this dark world (see Colossians 3; Ephesians 4).

This series will begin with ashes, then proceed to salt, water, light, bread, and palms. Then, during Holy Week, the focus shifts toward water and blood, wood, fragrant oil, and finally, on Easter, milk and honey. All these beautiful Old and New Testament elements will remind you of God’s eternal love in Christ, fill you with renewed hope, and increase your joy, knowing that because we are His baptized children, God is near to us now more than ever.

News from the Council and Recent Voters Meetings

Large Print Hymnals: Two copies of the large print hymnals are on the table to your left as you enter the sanctuary. These additions were added to make it easier to see all the words. Large print bulletins are also available with the hymnals. If these become well used, we will order additional copies.

Amplified Headsets: Five rechargeable headsets will be coming soon. If you have difficulty hearing the sermon or other portions of the service these may be a blessing.

Members of the congregation will wear them to be aware of how much they amplify and how to adjust the sound. They will be in easy access as you enter the Sanctuary. If they are well used, we will obtain more. Voters agreed to use funds (1,298.00) from the undesignated memorials to cover this cost.

Hand Chimes: The silent dessert auction organized to secure funds to purchase hand chimes, plus contributions, brought in over \$3,435.00. The chimes will complement our bells and encourage young musicians to become involved in music with an easy instrument to play. Voters agreed to take the balance needed (\$5,641.29) from the designated memorials and if needed the Wilkins fund.

Missionary Visit: Pastor and Heidi Paul will be in the states this summer and will spend time in Great Falls in June or July. An event will be planned together with Peace when more specifics are known. Our Mission and Evangelism committee is planning several fellowship activities, the first to be on April 22nd, a wild game feed.

Changes: The Trustees have been making improvements for the past two years in caring for the facilities. One that you may notice in the near future is a raised safety railing around the balcony. A refurbishing/modified layout of the Stahlecker Room is to begin by forming an "idea" committee. If interested, contact the church office. Then there is the roof fund which continues to build for the time when replacement is necessary.

Wee Disciples Childcare and Preschool: In the past week Wee Disciples received a *FOUR STAR* rating from the DPHHS. (Dept of Public Health and Human Services), one of only five in the city to have such a high rating. Thanks to Debbie Lee and her staff! A blessing to have this as a part of Trinity's ministry.

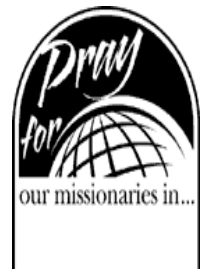

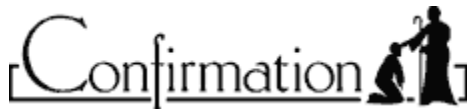
Meet Our Confirmands



Lutherans for Life of Cascade County and Vicinity has been active in Great Falls since 1980. We have supported the sanctity of life issues in a variety of ways throughout the years. Since 2010 we have been standing against

abortion through this **prayer vigil in front of Planned Parenthood, 211 9th St. So.** In our city this endeavor has been organized by the Catholic Church with our organization taking several days or portions of days. This year Lutherans for Life is standing in prayer **every Monday afternoon from 1:00-6:00 pm through the month of March.** Witnesses from Faith, Trinity, Triumph and Peace have participated as well as Christians from other congregations. Over 60 million lives have been lost through abortion in the past 50 years. Is it because we have been silent. The sanctity of life issue still needs those who are willing to stand in the square praying that hearts are changed regarding the value of life.
