





What is Worship: The Settings of the Divine Service

Have you ever wondered why we call our worship service "The Divine Service"? The Divine Service comes from the German word, *Gottesdienst*, which means, "God's Service." God comes to us in worship to serve us through His Word and Sacrament. He grants us forgiveness of sins, strengthens our faith, and gives us the promise of everlasting life. We receive His good gifts by faith. Then, after we have received those gifts, we respond with thanks and praise to God for all He has done for us.

Our Hymnal includes five Settings of the Divine Service. Throughout the year, we use all five settings, and typically change settings every 4-6 weeks. The language and music differ between some of the settings, but each setting has the same basic structure and flow. They each begin with Confession and Absolution, continue with the Service of the Word, and the Service of the Sacrament follows the Sermon, Offering, and Prayers.

Setting 3 of the Divine Service probably sounds familiar to those who grew up with *The Lutheran Hymnal* (published in 1941). This setting, also called the Common Service, served as the primary Communion Service in the LCMS for nearly 70 years. Settings 1 and 2 share the same texts but use different music for the liturgy. Setting 4 is a simpler setting with less music, and more spoken liturgy.

During the month of October, we will celebrate the Lutheran Reformation by using Divine Service Setting 5. This is an adaptation of Martin Luther's *German Mass*, which he published in 1526. Prior to the Reformation, worship services throughout Europe were conducted in Latin, even though most of the populace did not know how to speak Latin. One of Luther's Reforms was to prepare a service in the language of the people so that they could understand and follow along with the service.

Setting 5 includes more hymns than we typically sing, but most of these will be printed in the bulletin in order to make the service easier to follow.

Some people prefer one Setting more than another. Some people like to sing "This is the Feast" in Setting 1 or 2. Others prefer the simplicity of Setting 4, or the familiarity of Setting 3. Some people like all of the singing of Setting 5. Which is your favorite?

Starting wage is \$13/hour but can increase quickly after training, which is paid for by Wee Disciples, and depending on experience. CPR/First Aid and a background check are also required.
