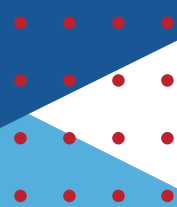

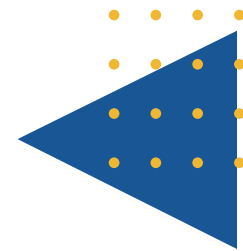
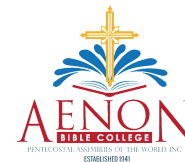

Establishing an Aenon Institute

Aenon Bible College was founded in 1941 and is the official educational and leadership training institution for the Pentecostal Assemblies of the World, Inc. Aenon Bible College provides a series of transformative ministerial training programs aimed at elevating and enhancing the maturation of ministers, teachers, pastors, and church leaders through a variety of innovative licensing programs.

Aenon Bible College is seeking to hire Clinical Faculty (Adjunct Teachers) to work in our satellite programs referred to as Aenon Institutes or Bible Institutes. We have developed an international instructional delivery model, and we are seeking to engage highly energetic, academically prepared, and seasoned bible scholars who desire to be a part of a dynamic and fast-growing Apostolic Pentecostal college.

Apostolic Pentecostal scholars from established Apostolic Pentecostal organizations may also apply for employment opportunities. District Councils and individual churches in the Pentecostal Assemblies of the World interested in establishing an Aenon Institute will be required to follow all guidelines, protocols, procedures, and policies established by Aenon Bible College of Indianapolis, Indiana.



Rules of Engagement

- All District Councils and individual Apostolic Pentecostal churches are eligible to operate an Aenon Institute and must apply to be approved by the Administration at Aenon Bible College, Indianapolis, in order to open, operate, enroll and provide instruction to students through Aenon Bible College, Indianapolis.
- Aenon Institutes may be developed by District Councils or individual churches who endorse and support the vision, mission and core values of Aenon Bible College, Indianapolis.
- All Aenon Bible Institutes must align their curriculum, instructional models and all academic methodologies with the policies, procedures, and format of Aenon Bible College, Indianapolis.
- All Clinical Faculty at Aenon Bible Institutes must be approved by the Administration at Aenon Bible College, Indianapolis, and all staff members will be reviewed annually to assess teaching effectiveness, and instructional capacity.
