

Trash Totes and Service: All household trash MUST be contained in the proper trash tote. Our refuse company is not obligated to pick up any trash that is outside the trash tote. If you have large items to dispose of, you may contact GFL (our provider) at 757-487-2220 and request a special pick up for which they will charge a small fee, or you can take the item(s) to the York County disposal site. Trash totes may be placed at curbside after 5:00pm (the evening prior to service day) and returned to your storage area inside your fenced area or in your garage not later that 7:pm the day of service. Pulling the tote up to the garage or along side of your house is not acceptable. In the event of a Federal holiday, the traash may be delayed one day.

Did you know...

Library of Virginia provides access to historical archive of Virginia newspapers

The Library of Virginia's online historical archive of Virginia newspapers, Virginia Chronicle, provides free access to full text searching and digitized images of over 5 million newspaper pages. These historic newspapers give glimpses into the lives of Virginians from 1736 to 2020, outlining everything from local politics to community happenings to notable moments in American history. You can browse the collection by newspaper title or by date.

Library of Virginia recently notified us that the York Town Crier (1978-2001) and its successor, York Town Crier: The Poquoson Post (2002-2019), have been digitized and added to the collection. Check out the October 11, 1984 York Town Crier, pages B2-B6, and read about the grand opening of the original Yorktown Library in 1984.

Virginia Chronicle is also a great resource for local historians and genealogists. Check out these moments in history:

- You'll find issues of the Virginia Gazette dating back to September 3, 1736.
- The Declaration of Independence is printed in the July 20, 1776 issue, on page 2 of the Virginia Gazette.
- Correspondence between General Grant and General Lee about the surrender of the Army of Northern Virginia is in the Alexandria Gazette, Volume 66, Number 81, April 10, 1865.
- Read about the assassination of President Lincoln in the Alexandria Gazette, Volume 66, Number 86, April 15, 1865.

Virginia Chronicle is a product of the Virginia Newspaper Program, which works to locate, describe, inventory, preserve, and provide public access to United States imprint newspapers housed at the Library of Virginia and throughout the Commonwealth. Virginia Chronicle contributes images to Chronicling America, the national version of this database.

PAINTING - We continue to paint on our projected schedule and can only stay on schedule with your help. Prior to painting, approximately a week before, you'll receive a notice that painting/power washing will be completed - it's imparative you move items off your porches pads and out of the way. If you fail to move your items, the house will not be cleaned/ painted, and no make-up dates will be honored. It's a simple task to take care of - please do your part. Also, to ensure you don't get hit with a bill to replace rotten wood in your soffit, make sure you are cleaning our your gutters! If the reason for rotten wood is overflow from dirty/clogged gutters, the HOA will not pay for those repairs. Repairs due to homeowner neglict will be the homeowners responsibility.

FENCE REPAIR - The Smithy Glen board would like to thank everyone who stepped up and made much needed repairs to their fences. The new and repaired fences look exceptional! Remember that the wood needs to cure before staining, usually 3 months after installation. Also, be sure to use only the Smithy Glen approved color Sherwin Williams SuperDeck Oil Based Semi Transparent -

"Riverwood" or Olympic Elite Semi-Solid "Canyon Sunset". All fences that were repaired and replaced are overdue for staining, please take action to stain your fences with the proper stain listed above. There are still many fences that need some love please spend a little time on your fences to add some screws to tighten them up, replace damaged boards and stain accordingly.

- Computers: desktop and laptop computers, servers, computer monitors, cell phones, computer wiring, desktop printers including multifunction printers or "All in Ones", fax machines, and desktop photocopiers and scanners
- ▶ <u>Household Maintenance</u>: latex paint, oil based paint, stains, solvents, glue, varnishes, adhesives
- <u>Automotives- limited to</u>: gasoline and other fuels, waxes, gas/oil mixtures, brake fluid, engine cleaner, tar remover NOTE: Motor oil and antifreeze accepted for Hampton residents only; other communities dispose of at your convenience centers.
- ▶ <u>Lawn & Garden</u>: insecticides, weed killers, pesticides, fertilizers, pest strips
- ▶ <u>Household Cleaning</u>: cleaners for oven, drain, toilet, septic tank etc., floor waxes, metal polishes, bleach, degreasers
- ▶ <u>Miscellaneous</u>: charcoal fluids, dyes, kerosene, pool chemicals, fluorescent lights up to 8 feet, all compact fluorescents (CFLs), rechargeable batteries
- ▶ <u>Propane Cylinders:</u> 1 and 20 pound cylinders only; limit 2 per vehicle per event for James City County, Poquoson, Williamsburg, and York County residents; unlimited per vehicle per event for Hampton residents.

Household Chemical Collection

- Do not smoke.
- Do not leave material in hot, unventilated areas for long periods.
- When possible, keep products in original container and ensure lids or caps are tight.
- Place items securely in boxes for transport.
- To prevent unfavorable chemical reactions, do not put multiple containers in bags or soft containers where they may spill or break.
- If you have a leaking container, place this item separately in a clear plastic bag, with newspaper or paper towels on the bottom. Secure in an upright position so it doesn't spill in your vehicle. Please notify staff that the item is leaking.
- MXI is the premiere service provider for household hazardous waste collection events sponsored by states, counties, and municipalities and provides disposal services at the VPPSA events. With a fleet of permitted vehicles, national network of terminals, staff of highly trained personnel, and a Materials Recovery Facility, MXI offers a full range of recycling and disposal services using the cutting edge of universal hazardous waste management technology.

Computer Recycling

- Since 2001, our contractor, Computer Recycling of Virginia, has erased every hard drive using software that meets or exceeds all industry standards, including the NIST 800-88. Once the wipe process is complete, any hard drive that fails the wipe process is physically destroyed.
- The mission of Computer Recycling of Virginia, Inc. (CRVA) is to place educationally—useful equipment into Virginia's schools and non-profit organizations free of charge, while promoting electronics recycling throughout Virginia.

At the collection:

- A VPPSA employee will ask which city or county you live in, and what materials you've brought. Proof of residency may be required.
- VPPSA staff will unload your vehicle. Please stay in your vehicle unless requested to do otherwise.
- There are separate drop off points for household chemicals and computers.
- Be prepared to identify your materials. If unsure, tell VPPSA staff before they begin unloading.

Thanks for your patience and cooperation.

Alternative Recycling and Disposal Sites

Best Buy accepts computer components at no charge (limit three items per household per day). Computer monitors and televisions are accepted at a \$29.99 charge per item (limit two items per household per day). TVs accepted are tube TVs smaller than 31" and flat-panel TVs - LCD, plasma, and LED - smaller than 49". Mobile phones are accepted at no charge (limit three items per household per day). See www.bestbuy.com/recycling for a complete list of acceptable and unacceptable items that Best Buy recycles.

Batteries Plus accepts the following: alkaline batteries at a charge of \$1.85 per pound; Compact Fluorescent Lamps at a charge of \$0.66 per bulb; four-foot fluorescent tubes at a charge of \$0.52 per tube; eight-foot fluorescent tubes at a charge of \$0.93 per tube; rechargeable batteries, such as Nickel-Metal Hydride and Nickel-Cadmium, are accepted at no charge. Items should be loose when taken to the store as they will be weighed/counted to determine the total charge. Batteries Plus accepts unlimited quantities.

NOTE: All of the above prices may be subject to change.

Goodwill Industries accepts computer components for recycling at no charge. Goodwill uses a U.S. Department of Defense-grade program on all donated devices to clean hard drives and erase personal and sensitive information.

Additional electronics are accepted for donation.

ARC

A quick reminder - if you plan on doing any work to the exterior of your residence (windows, doors, fence etc) before you complete the work, you must have an approved ARC request. Adhering to the guidelines is vital to:

- 1. Preserving Property Values
- 2. Promotes Community Harmony
- 3. Ensuring Fairness
- 4. Maintaining Safety and Functionality
- 5. Enhancing Long-Term Planning

Please be familiar with the guidelines before starting a project. Submit the proper requests and engage with the HOA. If you fail to get approval prior to completing the job, you face having to remove or replace the completed work - don't risk the large financial input!

Rules and Regs: DID YOU KNOW? Coventry is a covenant community which means we have rules to keep our neighborhoods attractive and welcoming. Here are some of the important guidelines to follow:

Animals: Residents may have a maximum of TWO four legged animals. All dogs must be on a leash, and owners are responsible for cleaning up after their pet.

Nuisances: These include behaviors which affect your neighbors such as: unusually loud music, continuously barking dogs, irresponsible use of bicycles, skateboards, and scooters. This also includes unsightly materials left out where they can be seen by neighbors.

Flower Beds: The flower beds on your property are the residents responsibility to be kept in a neat and attractive condition. Weeds must be removed in a timely manner, beds should be mulched annually, and shrubs need to be pruned on a regular basis.

Everyone knows the saying - "See something, Say something". This saying doesn't just apply to notifying the police of strange behavior, but also applies to your community and the everyday actions. If you see something you know is wrong in the community - report it through use of a CAF. This is an anonymous process! The reporting will eliminate unsightly items like this in the community! Provide the specifics such as the address of the individual that dumped the junk, and the board will take care of the rest.

Left in from the last newsletter because of importance -From Your Master Board:

Coventry homeowners have requested online bill pay for homeowners dues for many years. After exploring a number of options and resources, in 2024 the Master Board decided to contract with Town Management to provide bookkeeping services. With this contract a portal is provided to benefit Coventry homeowners. There is one big change coming - the last date for payment has always been the 15th of the month, that's staying the same. However, if you pay by dropping off to the office, it must be dropped off by the 10th of the month so that it can be processed to the bank. If not received by the 10th, it will be late.

The Portal offers the following features for you to use:
- Check your association's account transaction and make a payment

- Update your resident profile with the latest information
- Access the latest documents uploaded by your community Contact your board or association manager
- View announcements and alerts for the community

Town Management provides the bookkeeping services for our community. Use of the portal for homeowner dues payments is encouraged, however payments will be accepted in the office and sent to Town Management for processing with Alliance Association Bank. Please allow time for your individual account to be updated by Town Management.
