


#### Did you know...

Library of Virginia provides access to historical archive of Virginia newspapers

The Library of Virginia's online historical archive of Virginia newspapers, Virginia Chronicle, provides free access to full text searching and digitized images of over 5 million newspaper pages. These historic newspapers give glimpses into the lives of Virginians from 1736 to 2020, outlining everything from local politics to community happenings to notable moments in American history. You can browse the collection by newspaper title or by date.

Library of Virginia recently notified us that the York Town Crier (1978-2001) and its successor, York Town Crier: The Poquoson Post (2002-2019), have been digitized and added to the collection. Check out the October 11, 1984 York Town Crier, pages B2-B6, and read about the grand opening of the original Yorktown Library in 1984.

Virginia Chronicle is also a great resource for local historians and genealogists. Check out these moments in history:

- You'll find issues of the Virginia Gazette dating back to September 3, 1736.
- The Declaration of Independence is printed in the July 20, 1776 issue, on page 2 of the Virginia Gazette.
- Correspondence between General Grant and General Lee about the surrender of the Army of Northern Virginia is in the Alexandria Gazette, Volume 66, Number 81, April 10, 1865.
- Read about the assassination of President Lincoln in the Alexandria Gazette, Volume 66, Number 86, April 15, 1865.

Virginia Chronicle is a product of the Virginia Newspaper Program, which works to locate, describe, inventory, preserve, and provide public access to United States imprint newspapers housed at the Library of Virginia and throughout the Commonwealth. Virginia Chronicle contributes images to Chronicling America, the national version of this database.

#### **SOME THINGS ARE WORTH REPEATING!**

Our past newsletters have addressed issues that may not be comfortable, but necessary to talk about. We want to maintain a positive tone but need to be realistic about the issues that neighbors are concerned about. So, let's review a few of the issues that continue to be in the top Facebook and CAF discussions and are raised by our residents during open meetings.

#### DOGS!!!! Be a Good Neighbor!

During almost every Meeting, Smithy Glen residents urge the Board to increase efforts in educating residents about the issue of dogs leaving waste in flower beds. Despite repeated mentions past newsletters, there seems to be a limit to what can be done. The plea remains for residents to demonstrate courtesy towards their neighbors by refraining from allowing their pets to relieve themselves in flower beds.

Without a name or picture, the Board's ability to address the issue is severely limited. However, it begs the question: why should residents feel compelled to report on each other just to prevent dogs from relieving themselves in their neighbors' flower beds? And why are multiple time offenders not learning from the excessive fines? We've been having a horrible time with people just letting their dogs relieve themselves, and make no effort to clean up their mess. If you have a dog, it's your responsibility to clean up after them. If you see someone not cleaning up, report it, give a description - and it's even better if you know where the dog resides. Fill out a CAF! It's the only way to help solve the problem. As responsible pet owners, it is our duty to keep our furry friends safe and happy while also being respectful of our neighbors and community. Using a leash and picking up after your dog are not only CHOA mandates, but also important steps in being a good neighbor. Picking up after your pet helps keep our community clean and enjoyable for all. It's important to remember that our actions impact those around us, and it's our responsibility to be considerate of our neighbors who walk the paths and the children who run and play in the grassy common areas.

Smithy Glen governing document titled "Design Document Smithy Glen HOA Sub", Use restrictions, para G, page 8, Animals, states:

No animals, livestock, or poultry of any kind shall be raised, bred, or kept upon any Lot or within any townhouse thereon or in the Common Area, except such dogs, cats, or other household pets as may be permitted by the rules and regulations adopted by the Association. Homeowners are restricted to two four legged Pets. The document also clearly states that No animals should be allowed to run free. All dogs must be on a leash.



#### York County School Zone Camera Project

In a major initiative to enhance the safety of children in our community, York County has launched new school zone speed enforcement cameras. Go-Live date was September 25, 2024 and the citation cost is \$100. The cameras are located at Bruton High, Dare Elementary, Grafton Bethel Elementary, Seaford Elementary, Tabb Elementary and York High. The primary concern is the safety of our children. By implementing school zone speed cameras, the Sheriff can enforce speed limits more effectively, even when officers are not physically present. This technology ensures continuous monitoring and enhances the safety of school zones.

#### Spring is in the Air

Most of us are ready for winter to leave us, the snow and cold have been tough and we're ready for Spring. With Spring comes the high levels of pollen and allergies, keep up with your tissues! Also, it's time to get out and spruce up your flowerbeds around each of your houses. Please get fresh mulch spread, and maybe some new flowers. Inspections will begin soon on your flowerbeds 4 and fences - let's keep Smithy Glen looking great!

- Computers: desktop and laptop computers, servers, computer monitors, cell phones, computer wiring, desktop printers including multifunction printers or "All in Ones", fax machines, and desktop photocopiers and scanners
- ▶ <u>Household Maintenance</u>: latex paint, oil based paint, stains, solvents, glue, varnishes, adhesives
- <u>Automotives- limited to</u>: gasoline and other fuels, waxes, gas/oil mixtures, brake fluid, engine cleaner, tar remover NOTE: Motor oil and antifreeze accepted for Hampton residents only; other communities dispose of at your convenience centers.
- ▶ <u>Lawn & Garden</u>: insecticides, weed killers, pesticides, fertilizers, pest strips
- ▶ Household Cleaning: cleaners for oven, drain, toilet, septic tank etc., floor waxes, metal polishes, bleach, degreasers
- ▶ <u>Miscellaneous</u>: charcoal fluids, dyes, kerosene, pool chemicals, fluorescent lights up to 8 feet, all compact fluorescents (CFLs), rechargeable batteries
- ▶ <u>Propane Cylinders:</u> 1 and 20 pound cylinders only; limit 2 per vehicle per event for James City County, Poquoson, Williamsburg, and York County residents; unlimited per vehicle per event for Hampton residents.

#### **WE WILL NOT ACCEPT:**

- Televisions
- Alkaline Batteries
- **♦ Explosives**
- **♦ Ammunition or Gun Powder**
- ♦ Household Trash
- ♦ Business or Medical Waste
- ♦ Radioactive Products
- Large quantities of unknown materials
- Containers larger than 20 gallons

#### **Household Chemical Collection**

- Do not smoke.
- Do not leave material in hot, unventilated areas for long periods.
- When possible, keep products in original container and ensure lids or caps are tight.
- Place items securely in boxes for transport.
- To prevent unfavorable chemical reactions, do not put multiple containers in bags or soft containers where they may spill or break.
- If you have a leaking container, place this item separately in a clear plastic bag, with newspaper or paper towels on the bottom. Secure in an upright position so it doesn't spill in your vehicle.
   Please notify staff that the item is leaking.
- MXI is the premiere service provider for household hazardous waste collection events sponsored by states, counties, and municipalities and provides disposal services at the VPPSA events. With a fleet of permitted vehicles, national network of terminals, staff of highly trained personnel, and a Materials Recovery Facility, MXI offers a full range of recycling and disposal services using the cutting edge of universal hazardous waste management technology.

#### **Computer Recycling**

- Since 2001, our contractor, Computer Recycling of Virginia, has erased every hard drive using software that meets or exceeds all industry standards, including the NIST 800-88. Once the wipe process is complete, any hard drive that fails the wipe process is physically destroyed.
- The mission of Computer Recycling of Virginia, Inc. (CRVA) is to place educationally—useful equipment into Virginia's schools and non-profit organizations free of charge, while promoting electronics recycling throughout Virginia.

#### At the collection:

- A VPPSA employee will ask which city or county you live in, and what materials you've brought. Proof of residency may be required.
- VPPSA staff will unload your vehicle. Please stay in your vehicle unless requested to do otherwise.
- There are separate drop off points for household chemicals and computers.
- Be prepared to identify your materials. If unsure, tell VPPSA staff before they begin unloading.

Thanks for your patience and cooperation.

#### **Alternative Recycling and Disposal Sites**

Best Buy accepts computer components at no charge (limit three items per household per day). Computer monitors and televisions are accepted at a \$29.99 charge per item (limit two items per household per day). TVs accepted are tube TVs smaller than 31" and flat-panel TVs - LCD, plasma, and LED - smaller than 49". Mobile phones are accepted at no charge (limit three items per household per day). See <a href="www.bestbuy.com/recycling">www.bestbuy.com/recycling</a> for a complete list of acceptable and unacceptable items that Best Buy recycles.

Batteries Plus accepts the following: alkaline batteries at a charge of \$1.85 per pound; Compact Fluorescent Lamps at a charge of \$0.66 per bulb; four-foot fluorescent tubes at a charge of \$0.52 per tube; eight-foot fluorescent tubes at a charge of \$0.93 per tube; rechargeable batteries, such as Nickel-Metal Hydride and Nickel-Cadmium, are accepted at no charge. Items should be loose when taken to the store as they will be weighed/counted to determine the total charge. Batteries Plus accepts unlimited quantities.

NOTE: All of the above prices may be subject to change.

Goodwill Industries accepts computer components for recycling at no charge. Goodwill uses a U.S. Department of Defense-grade program on all donated devices to clean hard drives and erase personal and sensitive information.

Additional electronics are accepted for donation.


