Want to become a coach?

Anyone can start the process of becoming a gymnastics coach: an athlete, parent or any other interested individual. The National **Coaching Certification Program (NCCP) has training for all** levels, from recreational to high performance.

To begin taking NCCP courses, you must turn 15 years old no later than the date of the course you would like to attend.

Coach Evaluation


Want to become a certified coach?

Being "Certified" means that you have demonstrated competency and as an NCCP coach have met professional guidelines within the NCCP. Gymnastics NCCP education in Canada is highly regarded, and certification provides professional status. It provides the participants and their parent's assurance that you have been evaluated within your specialty to provide safe yet challenging programs.

Coach **Coach Evaluator?**

NCCP Coach Developers include Learning Facilitators, Coach Evaluators, and Master Coach Developers. Coach Developers are trained to develop, support, and challenge coaches to go on honing and improving their knowledge and skills in order to provide positive and effective sport experiences for all participants. They are experts in learning and coaching.

Men's Artistic Gymnastics

GNL's men's program is in need of new passionate judges to help this amazing sport grow! The cost is \$35 and \$50, respectively.

Judging gymnastics is an excellent way to understand the sport at a greater level – this is great for coaches, athletes and parents! Judges who are selected for panel assignments at competitions are paid an honorarium for their time.
