

All About Insects!











There are many types of bugs, but why do we keep calling some of them insects?



An insect MUST have three body parts. A head, a thorax and an abdomen.



Thorax



Insects also have two long things on top of their head called antennae.






Insects use antennae to feel like we use our hands.



Insects have bright colors and patterns to protect themselves so that they do not get eaten.



Some, but not all insects have wings.



Insects also have teeth called mandibles.



Insects have a <u>skeleton</u> on the outside of their bodies. This <u>protects</u> them from <u>predators</u>, or things trying to eat them. It also keeps them safe from sun or rain.



Most insects do not come out in the winter because they eat plants. In the winter most trees don't have leaves and flowers aren't blooming.

What do they eat?



Most insects eat pollen or nectar from flowers.



However, social bugs like ants eat a <u>variety</u> of foods like leaves or anything they can find in your house.



Some bugs eat other bugs, like ladybugs.

Insects live in many different places. Some live in hives, like bees, and others build large protective hills, like termites.



Glossary

- 1. Abdomen: the rear part of the body of an insect
- 2. Antennae: one of a pair of long, thin body parts on the head of insects to feel and smell
- 3. Head: the top or leading part of an animal body that contains eyes and mouth parts
- 4. Hill: a raised area of land smaller than a mountain
- 5. Hive: something built by bees to live in
- 6. Mandible: jaw or mouth
- 7. Nectar: the sweet liquid a plant makes-bees use nectar to make honey
- 8. Pattern: something that repeats (happens over and over again)
- 9. Pollen: the fine, yellow powder made by a flowering plant
- 10. Predator: an animal that hunts other animals for food.
- 11. Protect: to keep safe
- 12. Skeleton: bones and cartilage that supports and protects the body
- 13. Thorax: the second or middle part of an insect's body
- 14. Variety: many different types of something
