### Pip the Pup SOR Books









## LET'S LEARN HEART WORDS

Adventures With Pip the Pup







Hi! I'm Pip the Pup. Let's learn about heart words. I bet you are wondering, "What is a heart word?"



This year we will learn high frequency words. We will read and write these words a lot, such as "at," "the," and "I."



Some high frequency words can be decoded or read easily. The word "at" is easy for us to read. We read, "/a/-/t/."




However, some words are irregular. These words contain parts that do not make their true sounds.



For example, in the word "said," we hear /s/, /e/, /d/. However, we spell the word s-a-i-d. This can be confusing.



That is why "said" is a heart word. We must remember the tricky parts by heart so that they become sticky.




We will remember that the letters "a-i" spell the sound /e/ in the word "said" by heart. Said is a heart word.






Think about the word "dad." Is that a heart word? Let's try each of its sounds - /d/, /a/, /d/. Do we hear each sound?



We will learn decodable high frequency words and irregular high frequency words this year.




If you come to a heart word, just remember back to what I taught you. We will take it from tricky to sticky.




# LET'S LEARN POP-ITS BLOCKS

Adventures With Pip the Pup









Hi! I'm Pip the Pup. Let's learn about word building pop-its. Pop-its are lots of fun, but we will use them to learn.






It is important to know that pop-its are a fun tool to learn with. We must remember to use them correctly.






We will use the pop-its to tap or segment words. The pop-its will lay flat on the table when we are learning.






The pop-its do not go in our mouths and we do not use them for anything but learning. Place them on the table.






Our teacher will give us the correct number of pop-its blocks. Make sure to keep the blocks snapped together.





Our teacher will give us a word to tap or segment. You will pop each block in like this for the sounds.






Let's practice with the word "sat." /s/ (POP), /a/ (POP), /t/ (POP). We give each sound just I pop.


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
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Let's try another word. Watch me pop out the word "sap." /s/ (POP), /a/ (POP), /p/ (POP). Do you think you can do that?






Remember that pop-its blocks give us a fun way to practice words. We do have to follow the rules to use them.

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


## LET'S LEARN SAY IT, TAP IT, MAP IT









Hi! I'm Pip the Pup. Let's learn how to say it, tap it, map it, and write it. We will use this as we learn new words.






First, we will check our supplies. We need chips, boxes, and a marker. These supplies are for learning only.






Next, we will listen for our teacher to give us a word. Listen closely so that you don't miss the word.






The teacher said the word "mat." We will say it back. Mat. Then, we will count the sounds we heard in the word.






Tap or put up a finger for each sound. /m/, /a/, /t/. How many sounds did we hear? Yes, 3. We will grab 3 chips.






Place I chip under each box for the 3 sounds. Next, we will push up the chips as we say each sound. /m/, /a/, /t/.






Let's do that all over again. Place the chips under the boxes and push them up again. /m/, /a/, /t/, mat.






It's important to put the word together. Let's do it once again and be sure to put it together. /m/, /a/, /t/, mat.









Next, we hear /a/ and write the letter "a." Lastly, we hear /t/ and write the letter "t." Nice work! Let's try it!




## LET'S LEARN SCIENCE OF READING

Adventures With Pip the Pup









Hi! I'm Pip the Pup. Let's explore the Science of Reading or SOR. SOR is a set of best practices to teach us how to read.






In SOR, we will learn to decode. When we decode, we make a connection between letters and sounds.






Look at this word. Watch as I make the connection between the letters and sounds to decode or read it.






In SOR, we will also encode. Encode means we take a spoken word and apply the sounds and letters to it.






Listen as I say the word "sat." Now watch as I take that spoken word and make a connection to the sounds and letters.






In SOR, your teacher might ask you to segment a word. This means to listen for all the parts within a word.






For example, your teacher might say the word "mat." You will segment each sound. /m/, /a/, /t/.






In SOR, your teacher will remind you to blend. This means to put a word back together after segmenting.





In SOR, you will learn about vowels and consonants. A-e-i-o-u or /a/, /e/, /i/, /o/, /u/ are the vowels we will learn.





In SOR, you will need to persevere. Decoding and encoding are hard work. Keep trying and you will get there.

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
