Tax Deductibility of Dues The AAUW website advises that national membership dues are \$59, of which \$56 is tax deductible as a charitable contribution. The remaining \$3 is not tax deductible because it supports the AAUW Action Fund's Capitol Hill Lobby Corps and get-out-the-vote activities. AAUW national life membership is \$1,180 and is fully tax deductible.

Fellow AAUW member and LUSD elementary teacher, Wendy Buchanan, was our March speaker. Wendy showed and told us about her experience in receiving a cochlear implant, which enables her to hear. Wendy lost most of her hearing from a high temperature when she was 15 months old and learned to compensate by becoming a very good lip reader along with various hearing devices. Eventually her hearing became more and more impaired, and since she was a good candidate for a cochlear implant, she decided to give it a try in one ear. A whole new adventure was ahead.

Following the surgery, all Wendy heard for several months were loud, undecipherable noises. With her husband's help, she had to relearn and retrain her brain to hear all the nuances of sound. Just a few months ago she had the second ear implanted, and it was a much easier adjustment. It made a tremendous difference in her ability to hear well and improved her balance. Wendy's obvious happiness and excitement, as well as the loving efforts of her husband in this successful experience, made the program one of joy and celebration, as well as education.
