January's Be Informed meeting found us learning about insurance policies. The takeaway from our knowledgeable speaker, State Farm's Pam Aberle, was that we need to make sure we are adequately covered. When many of us took out policies, houses were being built for about \$100 a square foot. That is now \$500+ a square foot, and it means that many homes are underinsured and could not be replaced with their insurance coverage. Two other important issues to consider: when we downsize in to a rental or care facility, it's important to look into a Renters Policy which insures your belongings, and Pam suggested considering an Umbrella Policy that covers all aspects of our needs at a cost-effective fee.

After our meeting, we enjoyed a lovely farewell luncheon for our friend, Fern Davis. She will be leaving Lodi soon to live with her daughter off the coast of Seattle. Although she will be sorely missed, we wish Fern good health, many new friends, and a wonderful new adventure.
