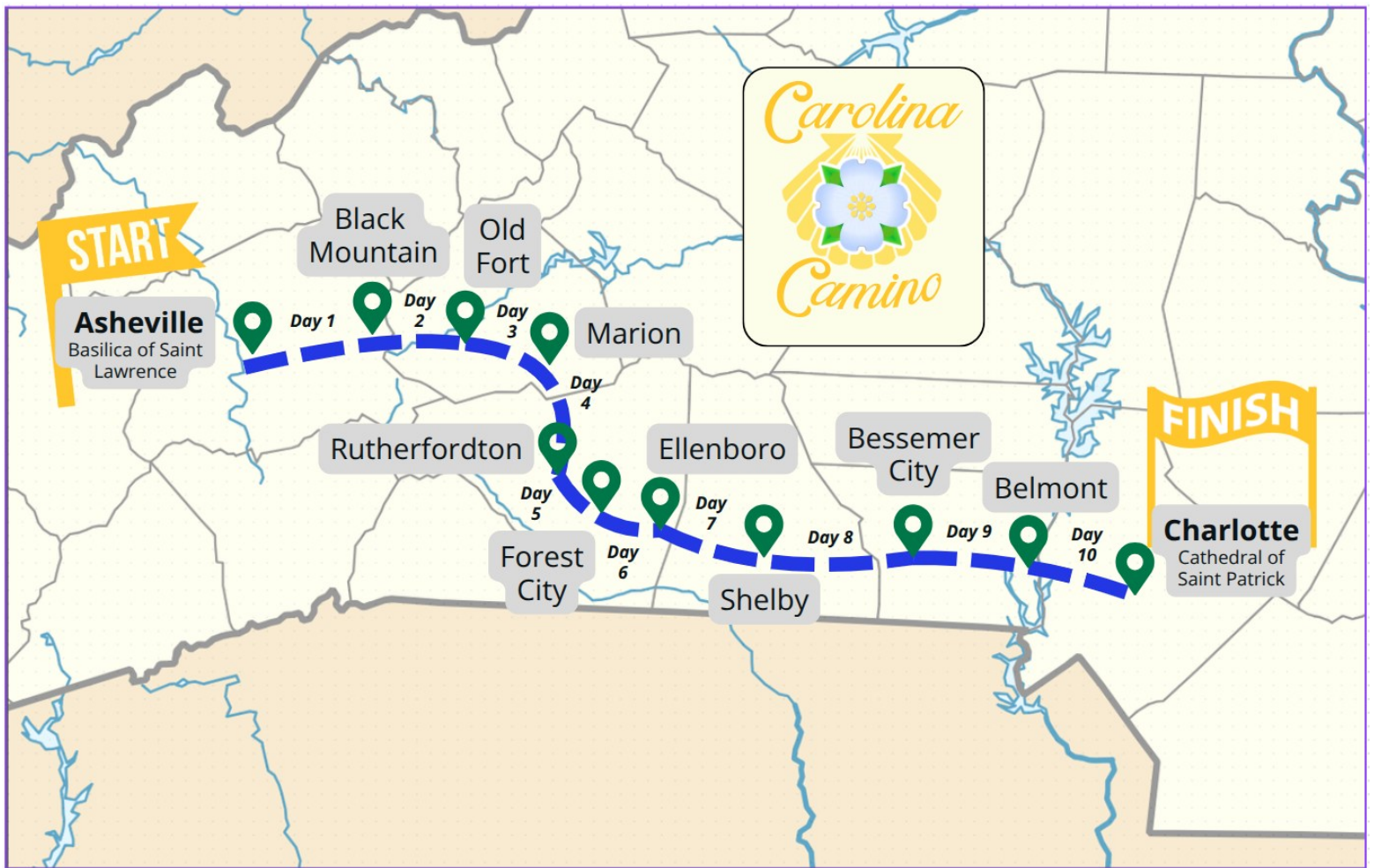

**2025 is a special Jubilee Year** -- a grace-filled season when the Church invites us to deepen our faith and encounter the Lord Jesus in new and surprising ways. For centuries, Christians have embraced pilgrimage to do just that. Today we enjoy modern comforts: a visit to the nearby shrine can be as simple as a car ride. But historically, pilgrimages meant long and challenging - but spiritually rewarding - journeys on foot across diverse landscapes. Choosing to walk revives this tradition of setting out in faith and hope.

A team of lay Catholic Christians from Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Salisbury invites you to share that experience. Step into the Jubilee Year of Hope by joining the 2025 Carolina Camino, a joyful 10-day, 145-mile pilgrimage hike from Asheville's Basilica of St. Lawrence to Charlotte's Cathedral of St. Patrick, August 26 – September 5, 2025, culminating in the Charlotte Eucharistic Congress.

Pilgrims will average about 14–15 miles a day and will be accompanied at all times by an on-call support van, so walkers of varied abilities can rest, avoid bad weather, bypass unsafe road segments, or handle emergencies with peace of mind.

The \$499.99 fee covers nightly lodging, van support, and basic supplies. Your place on the pilgrimage is secured as soon as your completed online application and full payment are received.

Simple accommodations are pre-booked (plus one night of primitive camping). Several meals are provided, and Sunday/Vigil Mass will be celebrated en route with the Benedictines of Mary in Rutherfordton -- along with daily opportunities for prayer and fellowship.
