October 1 – Voter Registration at the Prescott Farmers Market 7:30 – Noon.





How are housing costs affecting health?

Housing should represent a place of safety, stability, and shelter and not a place of stress, strain, or insecurity. When residents struggle to afford a place to live, that financial strain makes it harder to make other healthy choices, like eating a healthy diet or seeing a doctor when you're sick. Moreover, disruptive events, like suddenly losing your home, can become the trigger for a snowball of negative impacts on health, such as losing a job or health insurance, dropping out of school, or triggering mental health challenges.

Have you visited the League's **one-stop-shop** election web site - - VOTE411.org? You can register to vote, check your registration status, check if your ballot has been received and change your political party. You must re-register if you have moved, changed your name, or wish to change your political preference.

The most important and most impactful part <u>VOTE411.org</u> is the Virtual Candidate Forum. VOTE411.org has a variety of candidate information on Your Ballot for the local, state, and federal election. For each position covered you will find:

- 1) the Description of the Office, Position Requirements, and a special Why You Should Care section. And
- 2) A set of questions developed for the specific position. All candidates have the opportunity to reply to these questions and speak directly to you on these issues.

IMPORTANT ELECTION DATES

November 8 Election Day: Statewide General (All Registered Voters)

- Last day to <u>register to vote</u> for election: October 11, 2022.
- Mail ballots sent/In-Person Early Voting begins: October 12, 2022.
- Last day to request an early ballot by mail: October 28, 2022.
- In-Person Early Voting ends: November 4, 2022.
- Election Day: November 8, 2022
 - Vote Centers open 6 am to 7 pm.
 - All early ballots must be <u>received</u> by the County Recorder by 7 pm.
