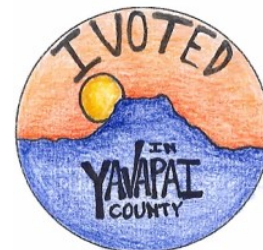

"JUSTICE GINSBURG: A MODEL OF CIVILITY"

(KIM WEHLE)

Ruth Bader Ginsburg (RBG) died on September 18 at 87. She was the second woman appointed to the Supreme Court where she served for more than 27 years. An advocate for civil rights and equality for men and women, she won most of her cases through her long and productive life.

Chief Justice John G. Roberts, Jr. said of Justice Ginsburg: "Our Nation has lost a jurist of historic stature. We at the Supreme Court have lost a cherished colleague. Today we mourn, but with confidence that future generations will remember Ruth Bader Ginsburg as we knew her -- a tireless and resolute champion of justice." supremecourt.gov/

It provides nonpartisan information to the public with both general and state-specific information of the election process. LWVAZ has submitted questions to statewide candidates whose responses will be uploaded directly to VOTE411.org database by LWVUS. LWVCYC will issue an announcement once the site is available for access.

Election Challenges During a Pandemic

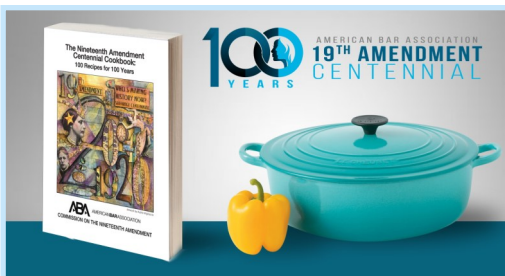
