

Herberger Young Scholars Academy August-September 2021

Description: Over six 50-minute class sessions, students will work in partnership with Rising Youth Theatre teaching artists to complete an original work cycle activating their own stories and experiences in youth-driven artistic process. Students will practice skills in community building, storytelling and story circles, creative and embodied research, devising and script writing, and performance. The residency will culminate with students sharing a short-format performance (about 1 minute per student).

Unit 1: August 11th and 13th	Story gathering and research
Unit 2: August 25th and 27th	Devising and playwriting
Unit 3: September 1st and 3rd	Rehearsal and performance

Materials:

- Journal notebooks (1 for each student)
- Pencils
- Whiteboard/whiteboard markers

- Production materials TBD (song downloads, props, costume pieces) purchased after week two

Unit One: Story gathering and research

Dates: August 11th and 13th

Objectives:

- Students will establish a foundation of trust with instructors and peers
- Students will understand, shape, and set up expectations for theatre using class values of presence, joy, love, respect, support
- Students will learn and practice personal narrative storytelling formats
- Students will choose a research topic inspired by personal lived experience *Learning Activities:*
 - Theatre games to establish trust and introduce embodied learning structures
 - Building classroom rituals
 - Topic selection
 - Story circles
 - Image Theatre

Unit two: Devising and playwriting

Dates: August 25th and 27th

Objectives:

- Students will practice using theatre exercises to synthesize and reflect on research
- Students will craft a performance outline based on their synthesis
- Students will practice performance techniques through the devising process Learning Activities:
 - Theatre games to establish trust and introduce embodied learning structures
 - Dialogue-based and gestural improvisation to devise scenes inspired by research
 - Writing of performance outline for a short individual or group performance

Unit three: Rehearsal and performance

Dates: September 1st and 3rd

Objectives:

- Students will rehearse their outline
- Students will practice basic acting, design, and staging techniques as appropriate
- Students will present a short performance for a peer audience

Learning Activities:

- Assigning production roles (actor, sound designer, director)
- Rehearsal process
- Performance for peers
