

Week 3: Highlights

Professional Speakers Series: On Wednesday, Mr. Dale Thrush, P.E. attended in person and shared his work as a consultant, in industry, and currently as an environmental engineer. He spoke about how he was inspired to choose his profession and how so many aspects of our daily lives are made easier and accessible by engineering. We especially like what he shared about the years needed to become an engineer, and the different types of engineers. As he said, "an engineer uses science and Mathematics to solve problems." Important as well is the work he does for the United States Environmental Protection Agency, helping to ensure that human health and the environment are protected.





On Thursday, via Teams from Vienna, Austria, Mr. Christoph Angster was our professional speaker. He is the representative for Austria at the United Nations on the subcommittee for the Human Rights of Older Persons and holds a deputy position in his national agency where he manages a team of 16 employees. Several campers made their introductions to him in German, as they had practiced with Dr. Moncrieffe in preparation. Mr. Angster, shared his journey through many life lessons.

The campers were then able to recall many of the lessons in their own words: "Say no to drugs and alcohol." • "Always ask for help." • "If you have an opportunity to leave your country and experience other countries, do so." • "Failure is part of success." • "Use your talent and skills, because in life you do not know what will happen." Other relevant subject matters he addressed overlapped with our camp's Model UN sessions.

Math, Money, and the Market: We were especially pleased to see Ethan's preparation for the Math, Money, and the Market sessions this week. He came with data that he researched and applied many of the lessons he has been learning over the past weeks. Additionally, Ethan asked a fellow camper for help and was very helpful through answering questions. Overall, Ethan took more chances and cared more about understanding over getting something right.

COMMITMENT: We endeavor to give our best while taking steps to secure short-term plans (with interim goals) and being purposeful to long-term goals. If your child attended Fusion 2.0 Pathways Camp for even one week, they can summarize their short- and long-term plans. They also know that their goals can be achieved if they stay committed to their plan, while being flexible and adaptable.

Throughout these four weeks, we helped campers work through their emotions and find ways to modulate. Also, we spoke about self-care and that they should distinguish their own thoughts from those of others. We encouraged space for mistakes, as growing up is a learning process. Importantly, we gave them activities and opportunities to be expressive—their voices are important, and they must be given a listening ear. With guidance, the choice is theirs to make, knowing that choices come with rewards and consequences. Essentially, we shared that if they are to become wise and more confident, they should be given opportunities to practice making their own decisions in a protective and caring environment.


