More than twenty current and former Pilbara residents were invited to contribute the photos that best describe their lives and feelings when living in the Pilbara. 'Our Stories in the Pilbara' photography exhibition at the Dampier Community Hall is part of the Harmony Week program to show the community with history, different stories and life experiences.

The Harmony Park Run is co-organised with the Bayview Park Run to raise awareness of the cultural diversity in Australia. There were 25 runners on the day celebrating multiculturalism together. This event is part of the Harmony Week program supported by the Department of Home Affairs and the Regional Arts WA.




Learning about Yum Cha Culture

Financial Summary-Treasurer's Report

The principal activities of the Northwest Multicultural Association WA Inc. during the year were to provide education, cultural and social activities to the members and the wider community. For the year ended June 30th 2022, the operating surplus of the Northwest Multicultural Association WA Inc. was \$14,285.85. This surplus will be continually used in more educational and cultural program to ensure the community diversification.




Revenue

The revenue of the Northwest Multicultural Association was \$29,540.18. Since it's the first year of operation, there is no comparison data from the previous year. The revenue was mainly due to the grants and funding from the government funding and leading companies' community grants, which accounted for 91% of the total revenue. The donation was from the president as the start-up funding.

Operating Expense

For the year ended June 30th 2022, the overall operating expenses of the Northwest Multicultural Association was \$8,753.80. The major expenses were for the Consulting & Accounting (including the program instructor fee during 2022 school term 2), the insurance, the rent (the rent refers to the venue hire costs), and the general expenses (including the program materials).
