We were a group of Malaysian students travelling from Kuala Lumpur to Perth with our student counsellors to join our new family being "Edith Cowan University".

We were driven to the Mount Lawley campus to check into the dormitory at 2.30am. As we came out of Perth airport. I felt the sudden coldness that stunned me for a while before I began to relax and enjoy my new surroundings. If I was to say; it was everything I expected that certainly would not be the case. It was even more magical and surreal. As we drove into the campus; one of the first few things that took me by surprise was to see the old Gumnut trees and how white their barks were in comparison with the rain forest trees that I grew up with. The mystery didn't just stop there; as I reached my dormitory room, I found a particular small machine and for a while just stared at it. To say I was naïve was an understatement. I picked up the gadget and turned it on. The loud noise surprised me and then I felt the heat come out of it. I laughed and thought to myself, well I am finally in another land with so many unknowns surrounding me. What do I do now? So started my journey in beautiful Australia.

Within a week, Edith Cowan University arranged for us to visit a wildlife park. Yes, another pivotal moment when I finally had my dreams come true; funny enough, it was always and will always be the simple things in life that we remember the most. I got to meet handsome Kangaroos, adorable wombats, amazing echidnas, curious emus and jaw dropping cuddly Koala Bears. I found out a lot about myself that day; in that I enjoyed exploring the unknown and in experiencing new adventures which made me more alive than ever. My fear had simply vanished.

Within a month in Perth, I had secured an apartment outside the university campus, part time work as a volunteer for various non for profit organisations, heading to the gym twice a day, enjoying my new life and newly found friendships at the various ECU campuses of Churchlands, Mount Lawley and Joondalup.

Outback Fashionista

COMMUNITY STORY JOY FRANCIS

I grew up with my mother in Pannawonica who was always doing uniform and ballgown alterations in our house for other people. She had taught seamstressing in the Philippines before moving to Australia, and had started teaching me from the age of about 5 how a sewing machine worked.

More recently, with my mum living with me in Karratha for about half of the year in 2022 I saw her doing alterations for people in town and it sparked my interest in making dresses again.

I went to the local craft shop and discovered the range of Indigenous fabrics which inspired me to make beautiful outfits for the local races which I started attending in 2021 after I lost 50kg with gastric surgery I had more confidence to get up and show my own style off, my first time was Ladies Day at the Roebourne Races. My style has evolved from using others designs at first, as I now feel more confident in my own unique design and also can go confidently in the knowledge that no one will ever have the same outfit.

The stories behind the prints are very interesting, I love to incorporate them into my designs and tell people the stories behind them, so I like to call my style Outback Fusion - my nine year old daughter helped me to pick out my Instagram name outback_fashionista as I was required to set up an account as I was selected to attend the WA State Final and flown down to Perth in November 2022 to compete against 11 other winners in the last ever State FOTF (Fashion on the Field) final at Ascot as it has now been cancelled. I design millinery (headwear to match each outfit).

I was then selected in March 2023 as the only competitor not from the East Coast to compete in the Top 11 at Mrs Australia International in Sydney. For the final we had several costume changes, so I decided to design an evening gown to incorporate my love of indigenous art and my platform - which is that all adults, children especially those from migrant backgrounds need to have swimming lessons, and this needs to be more accessible as I nearly myself drowned in a rip at the age of 16. I was a strong swimmer but had only learnt how to compete and attended swimming club in a pool and had no knowledge of the ocean dangers when we moved from Pannawonica to the coast when my father retired. I became a swimming teacher when my daughter reached school age due to the lack of teachers. My friend Sammy Wyborn from Perth (originally from Broome where I attended university) was the amazing artist who collaborated with me on the project, the result was amazing and reflected the colours of the ocean of the pilbara and the red dirt that surround us. The symbol on the dress is representative of community - and the many colours I believe represent all cultures coming together to support one another as a community, the blue across the chest is the water connecting communities, one on my back and another on the front of the gown.





I was awarded the Mrs Social Media award for 2023 for gaining the Mrs Australia **Beauty and Brains** pageant exposure on WA Television (Channel 7 Regional News) and several local radio stations. and came 2nd Runner Up in a **Sponsor Actively** award for being consistently physically active through the leadup to the pageant where they allowed us to use the app.

All contestants were empowered by attending many courses, and teambuilding sessions, so I believe this has assisted me in my daily life going forward to be more confident of my own inner strength and to encourage other women in remote communities and to promote the causes I believe in.

I am an Accountant and love to play my guitar and sing at local restaurants, it is another outlet of my creativity, and I enjoy horseriding with my children as I own two horses at the moment, however the fashion has taken over with my collection of hats and dresses outnumbering my guitar collection.

How I came to the Pilbara

In January 2014 my family, which consisted of my husband, 3 boys (6,4 and 1) and a dog, moved to the Pilbara for my husband's work. We had been spending quite a bit of time in the northwest over the past years and finally, over a 3 day travel period (which included several 45 - 50 degree days in rented trucks where the air-conditioning failed once it turned 40 degrees) moved all our family belongings to establish a new home in Karratha.

To be honest I was nervous and unsure about the move. At the time I was working fulltime as a corporate lawyer and with three young boys this was only possible through the help of family, babysitters, au pairs and a nanny. My husband spent a considerable amount of time travelling for work and whilst I knew many people in Karratha I did not have any family or strong friends. To make matters harder my mother was deeply unhappy about us moving so far away as she would no longer be able to see her grandchildren on an almost daily basis.

Fast forward nearly 10 years and I thank God every day for the decision we made to move to the Pilbara. There is no better place I believe in Australia to raise young children, especially three incredibly active, inquisitive boys. The community of Karratha is unique. Unlike many small country towns and cities, it is relatively easy to meet new people and more importantly, to meet and befriend people that become like family.

I no longer work as a corporate lawyer but instead swapped the relentless travel away from family to become the CEO of the Pilbara Kimberley University Centres. What an unbelievable opportunity to build an incredible institution that support higher education in remote WA. It is an absolute privilege to be a part of the wonderful PKUC family.

The Pilbara has introduced me to fantastic new interests such as water polo and mountain biking, which but for the move to Karratha I never would have tried and importantly, through these interests I have made some incredibly special friends that have become my ride or die pals. My children have thrived in the wonderful Pilbara environment that brings so many experiences and opportunities that are just not available in a city.

Anything is possible in the Pilbara if you are ready to have a crack. You can learn how to make traditional Japanese and Chinese dumplings from scratch, then head to the Karratha Leisure Plex for a swim and then end the day with a wonderful cold 'drink' down at the stunning Hearson's Cove, perhaps even watching the 'Staircase to the Moon'.

I love the Karratha, the Pilbara and WA's northwest. I do not believe that there is any better community in the world and it is my home. Nothing beats a stunning Pilbara sunset!





Our thanks to Mr and Mrs Sudharkaran and all the members of HAP for their wonderful hospitality.


