Book Signing by Admiral James L. Holloway III, USN (Ret).

In addition to our regular program, Admiral James L. Holloway III, USN (Ret), Chief of Naval Operations in 1974-1978 will be on hand during the social hour to sign copies of his new book "*Aircraft Carriers at War*, published by the U.S. Naval Institute. We will have a limited number of copies on hand available to members who desire to purchase them. Admiral Holloway currently is Chairman, Naval Historical Foundation.

He retired in 1978 as the 20th Chief of Naval Operations after 39 years of active service in the U.S. Navy, during which he served in combat in three wars. A 1942 graduate from the U.S. Naval Academy, his subsequent assignments included duty on destroyers in the Atlantic and Pacific during World War II, as a carrier jet fighter pilot in the Korean War and Commanding Officer of the nuclear powered aircraft carrier USS Enterprise (CVN-65) during combat operations in Vietnam.
