Colonel Gregory Breazile, USMC joined us at our September 8th general membership meeting to provide an overview of the efforts underway in Afghanistan to train the military and police forces in that country.

He noted that the actions they are taking in Afghanistan today are aimed at making the country a better place to live for the current and future generations of children. They have made

military academy, which has delivered two classes of professional junior officers, and the 900 female police officers, who have assumed their duties knowing they are targets of the Taliban.

Colonel Breazile feels that the NATO forces are making a difference and positive changes are taking place every day.

He highlighted the fact that Sailors, Marines, Soldiers, and Airmen are all represented in the NATO force And performing superbly.

He ended his remarks by stating that no matter how much progress they make improving the lifes of the afghan people, "we can never forget the guys we left behind."

What does the Northern Virginia Council of the Navy League do, besides hold meetings?

In 2009, NOVA Council paid out \$4100 to 34 members of our adopted ships. That included \$100 checks to Sailors/Guardsmen/Marines of the Quarter; and \$200 checks to those chosen for the Year. Also, every year we give several checks to ship and unit "welfare and recreation funds".

The Navy League supports the Sea Cadets as well as the U.S. Sea Services. In 2009, NOVA Council gave a check for \$500 to the Sea Cadet unit in Roanoke, VA

An important aspect to attract Sea Cadet recruits is a vibrant scholarship program.

NOVA Council has now given two annual scholarship checks, \$2000 each, from the John Camp Memorial Scholarship fund.

The NOVA Council does not charge its members annual dues. Awards, other than Scholarship checks, are paid from the dues (or Life Member fees) that you pay to Navy League US headquarters.

The cost of meals (food & beverages) for our speakers, honorees and their spouses, is always covered by the NOVA Council.
