Pastor's Ponderings

This week in worship we are continuing our series "Beguiled by Beauty: Cultivating a Life of Contemplation and Compassion", reflecting on the idea of seeing beauty even in moments when it is not immediately obvious. Dr. Wendy Farley, author of the book that shares it's name with our sermon series writes the following:

"We try to satisfy our thirst for meaningful life with so many distractions. Awakening to beauty is to find the well that never runs dry. For it is in beginning to truly see the world with our spirits that our soul's thirst is quenched. 'The resilience and beauty of the natural world is a song of hope, even when things are difficult.' A tree is scorched by fire and yet new sprouts shoot up, defiant and optimistically reaching toward the sun. A crack in a sidewalk reveals the seeds just beneath the surface waiting for a chance to break through. 'Divine beauty shimmers and shimmies through the universe in every barrio where someone is singing or weeping. Because of beauty, our spirits are enlivened.' Contemplating this reliant beauty draws us back to our own vitality and the promise that we, too, are capable of new life."

In worship this week we will be exploring how this awakening to beauty connects with our understanding of God. Psalm 147, our text for this week reminds us, "How good it is to sing praises to our God, how pleasant and fitting to praise him!" and invites us to remember the ways that God binds up the wounds of broken hearted, calls the stars by name, and is worthy of praise. May our hearts be tuned this week to the ways in which God is working and moving in the world, in large and small ways, seeing beauty even in unexpected places.

Donations of Required Minimum Distributions from Retirement Accounts

Did you know that you can make a donation of all or a portion of the Required Minimum Distribution from your retirement account to tax exempt charities, such as Lower Brandywine Presbyterian Church and your donation will be tax exempt?

Here's how it works. If a person is at least age 70%, they must take at least a minimum distribution from their IRA or incur a penalty equal to one-half of the otherwise required minimum distribution amount. They may take more than the minimum at their discretion. These individuals may instruct their IRA account manager to distribute any amount of their choosing to one or more tax exempt charities such as Lower Brandywine Presbyterian.

When that is done, it is considered to be a tax-exempt contribution. Lower Brandywine would acknowledge to the giver the receipt of that contribution from their IRA. Also, this contribution is tax exempt even if the individual does not itemize deductions for income tax purposes because the IRA account manager would not identify this to the IRS as reportable income in accordance with the tax code.

For more information about Qualified Charitable Distributions, check out the Internal Revenue Service Publication 590-B, "Distributions from Individual Retirement Arrangements (IRAs)" or speak with your tax advisor.
