

Pastor's Ponderings

In the Lenten devotional written by the editor of the Presbyterian Outlook, Teri Mcdowell Ott, this fourth week of Lent is about examining our dishonesty so that we might live with truth. It's a potent series of reflections, inviting us to consider the ways we are dishonest with ourselves and with God: Dishonest about what is true, about what we are capable of doing in partnership with God, dishonest about not having enough, dishonest about what we know and can know, dishonest about our history.

Ott's reflections lead us to examine the ways we prop ourselves up with illusions, myths, incomplete telling of history. Which is not the best way to find our identity or our security. But after our conversation with psychiatrist Dr. Ollie Yost, our final Digging Deeper speaker, we know how we come to have and to cling to some of these "truths". Imprinted upon our brains, reinforced in our bodies and connected to our emotions, these illusions or myths can become the way we understand the world.

Ott reminds us that in this season of Lent, God invites us to dig deeper – into our own assumptions and understandings, into our own experiences, into scripture – so that we may live life in the freedom that lies within the truth.
