Pastor's Ponderings

What Did Jesus Pray?

Have you ever wondered about what Jesus said when he prayed? We get one example when he teaches the disciples the prayer we now know as the Lord's Prayer and another in Jesus' emotional petitions in the Garden of Gethsemane but, these examples are certainly not the only recorded prayer of Jesus in the scriptures. This week in worship we will be looking at another prayer of Jesus that is in scripture, one that is recorded in John 17:6-19. In this passage, we get an inside look of a prayer that Jesus lifts up on behalf of the disciples, a prayer which invites the hearer to think, "What now?" and what comes next after Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection. One commentator, Brian McGowan writes that, "Hearing Jesus prayer (not think!) aloud here is an immense privilege. It's an amazing display of oneness with God and with his friends." But, this prayer is not just about what comes next for the disciples but, has much larger implications.

Rev. Bryan Findlayson, writing on Lectionary Bible Studies and sermons, describe this week's passage, John 17:6-19 in this way, "In our passage for study, John has recorded the prayer Jesus prayed in the upper room on the Thursday evening before his arrest and crucifixion. Way back in the sixteenth century a Lutheran theologian, David Chytraeus, gave the prayer the title "Jesus' High Priestly Prayer" and this title has stuck. In summing up the prayer, one of the great Bible commentator's, B.F. Westcott, writing at the beginning of the twentieth century, said, it is "at once a prayer, a profession and a revelation." This week in worship, we will unpack what it means that this portion of scripture is identified as a High Priestly Prayer and also dig more deeply into the idea that this is a prayer, profession and revelation and explore what this prayer means for us as modern believers.

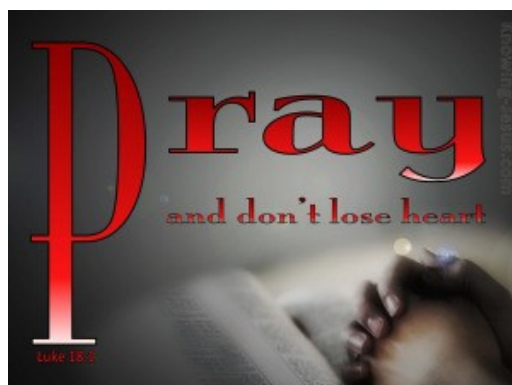

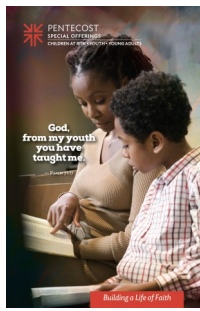

Donations of Required Minimum Distributions from Retirement Accounts

Did you know that you can make a donation of all or a portion of the Required Minimum Distribution from your retirement account to tax exempt charities, such as Lower Brandywine Presbyterian Church and your donation will be tax exempt?

Here's how it works. If a person is at least age 70½, they must take at least a minimum distribution from their IRA or incur a penalty equal to one-half of the otherwise required minimum distribution amount. They may take more than the minimum at their discretion. These individuals may instruct their IRA account manager to distribute any amount of their choosing to one or more tax exempt charities such as Lower Brandywine Presbyterian.

When that is done, it is considered to be a tax-exempt contribution. Lower Brandywine would acknowledge to the giver the receipt of that contribution from their IRA. Also, this contribution is tax exempt even if the individual does not itemize deductions for income tax purposes because the IRA account manager would not identify this to the IRS as reportable income in accordance with the tax code.
