As you read this, I will be away at a conference in the mountains of North Carolina, learning about how systems work in organizations, adaptive leadership, and how to more effectively understand both the spoken and unspoken aspect of a church's culture.

Many of you have noticed the large stack of books on my desk that I have been reading in preparation for this conference. While pre-work for the conference asked me to read 7-8 books, there are three that I wanted to recommend to you all. I know that we have many in our church and community who love to read and I encourage you to add the following to your "to read" list, as I have found them especially inspiring and challenging and they have encouraged me to think about our context at LBPC. All of them can be found at most major booksellers. If you do read them, I'd love to have a conversation with you about what *you* find inspiring or challenging in them.

-Christianity for the Rest of Us: How the Neighborhood Church Is Transforming the Faith by Diana Butler Bass

This book gave me so much hope by sharing stories about how churches across denominational and regional boundaries are finding ways to remain faithful to their traditions while becoming vital spiritual communities.

-The Art of Gathering: How We Meet and Why It Matters by Priya Parker

This book challenged me to think about why and how groups gather, whether in the church or in secular organizations.

-Canoeing the Mountains: Christian Leadership in Unchartered Territory by Tod Bolsinger

Using the experiences of the explorers Lewis and Clark, this book helps the reader to think about how to be adaptable and rethinking what effective leadership looks like in a constantly changing world.

I encourage you to keep reading, prayer, learning and thinking deeply!





Donations of Required Minimum Distributions from Retirement Accounts

Did you know that you can make a donation of all or a portion of the Required Minimum Distribution from your retirement account to tax exempt charities, such as Lower Brandywine Presbyterian Church and your donation will be tax exempt?

Here's how it works. If a person is at least age 70%, they must take at least a minimum distribution from their IRA or incur a penalty equal to one-half of the otherwise required minimum distribution amount. They may take more than the minimum at their discretion. These individuals may instruct their IRA account manager to distribute any amount of their choosing to one or more tax exempt charities such as Lower Brandywine Presbyterian.

When that is done, it is considered to be a tax-exempt contribution. Lower Brandywine would acknowledge to the giver the receipt of that contribution from their IRA. Also, this contribution is tax exempt even if the individual does not itemize deductions for income tax purposes because the IRA account manager would not identify this to the IRS as reportable income in accordance with the tax code.

For more information about Qualified Charitable Distributions, check out the Internal Revenue Service Publication 590-B, "Distributions from Individual Retirement Arrangements (IRAs)" or speak with your tax advisor.


