Pastor's Ponderings

Friends, this week is Holy Week, a time where we reflect on Jesus' betrayal, crucifixion, and resurrection. The stories we will explore this week are of Jesus' friends betraying him and of the crowds crying out to crucify him. It can all feel a bit too much to bear, especially as we hear the news of violence and hatred that seems all too common in the world. You may find yourself wishing that we could just skip the hard stories of Holy Week this year and fast-forwarding to the joy of Easter morning, the joy of celebrating the resurrected Savior. I invite us to resist that urge to skip ahead to the ending of the week and to spend intentional time with the scriptures that we lift up on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday—either joining us for worship in person or online, or spending time privately reflecting on these scriptures. This does not mean that you will not still feel overwhelmed but, perhaps the feelings will be balanced with the assurance that we are loved by a Savior who knows what it was like to be completely human, who felt hope and friendship and anger and joy and grief and all of the other human emotions. Friends, Easter is coming, hold onto hope. Below is a poem from Thomas Merton that has nourished my soul this Lenten season. I hope it reminds you that even as this week and our lives in general may, at times, feel so heavy and difficult that God is always with us.

*My Lord God, I have no idea where I am going.
I do not see the road ahead of me.
I cannot know for certain where it will end.
Nor do I really know myself,
and the fact that I think I am following your will
does not mean that I am actually doing so.
But I believe that the desire to please you
does in fact please you.
And I hope I have that desire in all that I am doing.
I hope that I will never do anything apart from that desire.
And I know that, if I do this,
You will lead me by the right road,
though I may know nothing about it.
Therefore I will trust you always
though I may seem to be lost
and in the shadow of death.
I will not fear, for you are ever with me,
and you will never leave me to face my perils alone.*

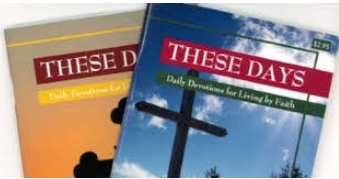

Donations of Required Minimum Distributions from Retirement Accounts

Did you know that you can make a donation of all or a portion of the Required Minimum Distribution from your retirement account to tax exempt charities, such as Lower Brandywine Presbyterian Church and your donation will be tax exempt?

Here's how it works. If a person is at least age 70½, they must take at least a minimum distribution from their IRA or incur a penalty equal to one-half of the otherwise required minimum distribution amount. They may take more than the minimum at their discretion. These individuals may instruct their IRA account manager to distribute any amount of their choosing to one or more tax exempt charities such as Lower Brandywine Presbyterian.

When that is done, it is considered to be a tax-exempt contribution. Lower Brandywine would acknowledge to the giver the receipt of that contribution from their IRA. Also, this contribution is tax exempt even if the individual does not itemize deductions for income tax purposes because the IRA account manager would not identify this to the IRS as reportable income in accordance with the tax code.
