And while we were out for our drive, we looked at the letter Paul sent to the early Christian community in Galatia. He wrote to them about freedom, the freedom they know through Jesus. No longer are they bound by the law. Now they are free – as he says, "For freedom Christ has set you free."

He reminds them that they are free, no longer beholden to the law out of fear that only by following it to the letter do they achieve a place in heaven. Now in freedom they may choose how they live. And Paul says to them, choose love.

Choose to love your neighbor as yourself. Choose to be bound to others in love. Choose to be enslaved to one another, as neighbors in Christ. Not enslaved as we know it, as they knew it under Rome – forced bondage, a hostage situation - but as a choice made in freedom. Knowing that this is no longer about securing our eternal life, but about honoring God, following Christ, and choosing love.

Christ has set us free and our freedom gives us choices. Together may we choose to be bound to one another in this human community – loving our neighbor as ourselves.



Donations of Required Minimum Distributions from Retirement Accounts

Did you know that you can make a donation of all or a portion of the Required Minimum Distribution from your retirement account to tax exempt charities, such as Lower Brandywine Presbyterian Church and your donation will be tax exempt?

Here's how it works. If a person is at least age 70½, they must take at least a minimum distribution from their IRA or incur a penalty equal to one-half of the otherwise required minimum distribution amount. They may take more than the minimum at their discretion. These individuals may instruct their IRA account manager to distribute any amount of their choosing to one or more tax exempt charities such as Lower Brandywine Presbyterian.

When that is done, it is considered to be a tax-exempt contribution. Lower Brandywine would acknowledge to the giver the receipt of that contribution from their IRA. Also, this contribution is tax exempt even if the individual does not itemize deductions for income tax purposes because the IRA account manager would not identify this to the IRS as reportable income in accordance with the tax code.

For more information about Qualified Charitable Distributions, check out the Internal Revenue Service Publication 590-B, "Distributions from Individual Retirement Arrangements (IRAs)" or speak with your tax advisor.

The Contemporary Service by Joan Wysham

The Contemporary Service at Lower Brandywine was started around 2000 when many churches felt their younger members would support a less structured service. By using modern music, less formal dress and order of service it was hoped it would encourage church attendance. Martha Marsey and I were the two elders on the Worship Committee, and she volunteered to head up the creation of that service. She had a few others on her committee, and they were the ones who hired Phil Calabrese who brought his wife Marilee with him to play the piano and sing. She also took the responsibility of creating a songbook by getting the music copyrighted, the music into book form and getting it printed. It has been a well-used music book.

Phil added to the service by playing the guitar, leading and singing, and getting other musicians to participate instrumentally. They made a joyful noise to the Lord.

This continued up until the present time. Then Covid struck and we did not have any church services for a time. Phil expressed his desire to retire, and the Session voted with the decline in attendance, we would go back to a single service. However, this story remains an example of how Lower Brandywine sought to expand its outreach
