#### An LBPC History Note by Joan Wysham

I joined LBPC in 1990 when the church was just starting the first of four building renovations. At the same time, the church seemed to be going through a re-evaluation of itself as a community of believers. Were we going to be a friend to all who came our way, or merely the place to do to church on Sunday mornings to worship God? We were following a ministry that emphasized choir type activities and the choir itself, so this was the time to decide what to do.

I gathered two groups of women, one to meet at noon with a bag lunch and dessert (to be provided by taking turns) and the other to meet at night, with just dessert. Both had the traditional Bible Study and prayer, but that turned out to be inadequate, so we decided to have a bazaar and use the money earned for it to outfit our brand-new kitchen. We bought two new stoves, a refrigerator, dishwasher, dishes, cutlery, pots and pans, and utensils with the proceeds.

Years later when we were going through another renovation in the sanctuary, we noticed that the minister (The Rev. Dr. Roy Martin) was preaching longer sermons, and we realized that the clock hanging on the balcony was missing. We bought a new clock that weekend and the sermons length was readjusted.

#### **Donations of Required Minimum Distributions from Retirement Accounts**

Did you know that you can make a donation of all or a portion of the Required Minimum Distribution from your retirement account to tax exempt charities, such as Lower Brandywine Presbyterian Church and your donation will be tax exempt?

Here's how it works. If a person is at least age 70½, they must take at least a minimum distribution from their IRA or incur a penalty equal to one-half of the otherwise required minimum distribution amount. They may take more than the minimum at their discretion. These individuals may instruct their IRA account manager to distribute any amount of their choosing to one or more tax exempt charities such as Lower Brandywine Presbyterian.

When that is done, it is considered to be a tax-exempt contribution. Lower Brandywine would acknowledge to the giver the receipt of that contribution from their IRA. Also, this contribution is tax exempt even if the individual does not itemize deductions for income tax purposes because the IRA account manager would not identify this to the IRS as reportable income in accordance with the tax code.

For more information about Qualified Charitable Distributions, check out the Internal Revenue Service Publication 590-B, "Distributions from Individual Retirement Arrangements (IRAs)" or speak with your tax advisor.


