Pastor's Ponderings

On my dresser is a picture of a woman I have never met and likely never will. She lives in Guatemala and is connected to the Guatemala Mission Group of New Castle Presbytery. But her presence in my life has changed the way I see my life.

One of the ways the Guatemala Mission Group asks folks to be in solidarity with the women they seek to serve in Guatemala is to become prayer partners. Each woman in the partnership is given the name of their prayer partner and a picture and that is all. And each prayer partner makes the commitment to pray daily for the other.

It seems a worthy gesture, a simple way to connect across borders and cultures. But it is far more powerful than I could have imagined. For praying for Rosa, imagining her life in Guatemala, as I look at her picture and hold her before God each day, has caused me to understand my own life in new ways. I have a deeper sense of unwarranted blessing, a greater awareness of my privilege, and an ear attuned to what is happening in the place she calls home and how the place I call home and the way I live are connected to her and to Guatemala.

My connection to Rosa has been an unexpectedly transformative experience and the source of growth for me. It is humbling to know that this woman in the midst of her daily life takes time to pray for me. Who am I that she would pray for me?

Rosa's companionship in my life has blessed me. I pray mine has been a blessing to her as well.

- **FINALLY...THE MISSION TRIP!** This year's mission trip will be in Woonsocket, R.I. from July 17— 23. We have 2 chaperones and 6 youth volunteers committed to attend.

The Blackstone River Valley has a long history in the world of manufacturing and commerce. By the mid-1800s, Woonsocket was one of the largest textile manufacturing centers in the United States, but it did not escape the Great Depression. Industry was a draw for immigrants seeking to establish a better life for themselves. French Canadians first arrived in the 1840's, followed by African American immigrants who began to arrive as a part of the Great Migration. Since the 1980s, many Southeast Asian, Latinos, and African immigrants have been calling Woonsocket home. City revitalization began in the 1990s and has continued into the 21st century, including housing renovation projects as well as focused improvements to the greater community.

Help the residents of Woonsocket realize this future and bring the vision to reality as you become part of a greater purpose through home repairs for the people of the Blackstone Valley.
