

Here are the key things Session discussed/voted on at the regular monthly meeting on September 26:

- Agreed to hold a low-key Christmas Day worship at 10:00 a.m. People will be encouraged to "come as you are" in comfy clothes.
- Agreed to allow non-elder church members to serve communion during worship and in-home communion for those unable to come to church.
- Pastor Nona held a new member's orientation meeting with nine interested participants. New members will be welcomed into the church on Reformation Sunday, October 30.
- A large portion of time was spent reviewing the work of the Strategy & Planning Committee. Objectives and initiatives have been broken into four groups - Worship, Grow, Connect, and Serve – with overarching objectives for Resources that impact and constrain the four groups. We need active feedback from the congregational dinners to validate what we've done so far and to generate ideas for the objectives and initiatives. We encourage as many people from the congregation as possible to sign up to attend a dinner, and may need to schedule additional dinner or luncheon dates.
- S&P has also summarized the CAT Survey results and will present to the congregation in mid-October.

Donations of Required Minimum Distributions from Retirement Accounts

Did you know that you can make a donation of all or a portion of the Required Minimum Distribution from your retirement account to tax exempt charities, such as Lower Brandywine Presbyterian Church and your donation will be tax exempt?

Here's how it works. If a person is at least age 70½, they must take at least a minimum distribution from their IRA or incur a penalty equal to one-half of the otherwise required minimum distribution amount. They may take more than the minimum at their discretion. These individuals may instruct their IRA account manager to distribute any amount of their choosing to one or more tax exempt charities such as Lower Brandywine Presbyterian.

When that is done, it is considered to be a tax-exempt contribution. Lower Brandywine would acknowledge to the giver the receipt of that contribution from their IRA. Also, this contribution is tax exempt even if the individual does not itemize deductions for income tax purposes because the IRA account manager would not identify this to the IRS as reportable income in accordance with the tax code.

For more information about Qualified Charitable Distributions, check out the Internal Revenue Service Publication 590-B, "Distributions from Individual Retirement Arrangements (IRAs)" or speak with your tax advisor.
