BEAUTY, GOODNESS AND FAITH

I've always loved illustrated children's Bibles. Even now, as an adult, I have a variety of them on my shelves. I've always loved the beautiful illustrations that bring the scriptures to life. One of the things that I have noticed in many of these Bibles is the portrayal of the story of creation. Usually there is a full page spread of perfectly well manicured grass, trees, and flowers with Adam and Eve in the foreground flanked by well behaved wild animals. Usually this picture is paired with some sort of version of the scripture in which God calls the things God created "good".

This week in worship will be pairing the creation narrative as it is told in Genesis 1 with Psalm 139, a psalm of praise, and thinking together about how these texts challenge us to contemplate the intersection of beauty and goodness and faith.

If this all sounds a bit too heady and you aren't sure that it applies to your life and faith these days, come to worship with those doubts and wonders. Come to wrestle and explore and dive deeper into God's word and into lives of compassion and contemplation.

This week in worship we will also be celebrating the Sacrament of Baptism, welcoming a young person into our family of faith, reminding them that they have been called good and are loved by God. In this sacrament of baptism we also recommit ourselves to being a community where all can explore, wonder, doubt, pray and experience God's goodness. I hope that you will join us or worship on Sunday either in person or online!



Donations of Required Minimum Distributions from Retirement Accounts

Did you know that you can make a donation of all or a portion of the Required Minimum Distribution from your retirement account to tax exempt charities, such as Lower Brandywine Presbyterian Church and your donation will be tax exempt?

Here's how it works. If a person is at least age 70½, they must take at least a minimum distribution from their IRA or incur a penalty equal to one-half of the otherwise required minimum distribution amount. They may take more than the minimum at their discretion. These individuals may instruct their IRA account manager to distribute any amount of their choosing to one or more tax exempt charities such as Lower Brandywine Presbyterian.

When that is done, it is considered to be a tax-exempt contribution. Lower Brandywine would acknowledge to the giver the receipt of that contribution from their IRA. Also, this contribution is tax exempt even if the individual does not itemize deductions for income tax purposes because the IRA account manager would not identify this to the IRS as reportable income in accordance with the tax code.


