Third Quarter 2025 Highlights: Born in a Bar, The Tun Tavern

Commemorating the 250th Birthday of the United States Marine Corps

On November 10, 1775, the Second Continental Congress meeting in Philadelphia passed a resolution stating that "two Battalions of Marines be raised" for service as landing forces with the fleet. This resolution established the Continental Marines and marked the birth date of the United States Marine Corps. Serving on land and at sea, these first Marines distinguished themselves in a number of important operations, including their first amphibious raid into the Bahamas in March 1776, under the command of Captain (later Major) Samuel Nicholas. The first commissioned officer in the Continental Marines, Nicholas remained the senior Marine officer throughout the American Revolution and is considered to be the first Marine Commandant. The Treaty of Paris in April 1783 brought an end to the Revolutionary War and as the last of the Navy's ships were sold, the Continental Navy and Marines went out of existence. Re-established as the Marine Corps on 11 July 1798

The Tun:

Tun Tavern was a <u>tavern</u> and brewery in <u>Philadelphia</u>, <u>Pennsylvania</u>, which was a founding or early meeting place for a number of notable groups. It is traditionally regarded as the site where what became the <u>United States</u> <u>Marine Corps</u> held its first recruitment drive during the American Revolution.

On November 12th, in addition to this year's Milestone 250th Birthday ball, Detachment 1316 will be hosting a **Cake Cutting Ceremony** at the American Legion Post #118 at 1730 for those who were not able to attend the big ball event at the Santa Ana Star Casino Hotel.

<u>The city's annual Veterans Day parade and ceremony</u> will take place along Southern Boulevard from Country Club Drive to Pinetree Road Nov, 11. Detachment 1316 will be leading the parade with the Grand Marshall Major Anthony Martinez. A ceremony at the Rio Rancho Veterans Memorial immediately following the Parade.

The parade will start at 10 a.m. After the parade, a ceremony will be held at 11 a.m. at Veterans Monument Park on Pinetree Road. People are encouraged to show their support from the sidelines and enjoy floats, marching bands, veteran groups and more.

Here is another event taking place in Santa Fe. On November 10th if anyone is interested hosted by the NMDVS.

The United States Marine Corps was established 250 years ago on November 10th, 1775. Join us as we celebrate the 250th anniversary of the United States Marine Corps. We will participate in the nationwide "50 State Cake-Cutting" initiative, coordinated by the Marine Corps Heritage Foundation, to honor Marine Corps traditions and legacy. The ceremony will honor our serving Marines and our beloved Marine Corps veterans with the presentation of colors, the reading of the state proclamation, the Commandant's official birthday message, guest speakers, and a cake-cutting ceremony to honor the Marine Corps Tradition.

On November 2, 2025, Marine Younis is participating in an 8-day hike on the Lemosho route up Mt. Kilimanjaro in Tanzania, Africa. At almost 45 miles, this trail passes through five ecosystems, from dense forest and heather up through alpine desert and the glorious summit. From the jungle to high desert, to snowy terrain. Travel day 3 elevation begins at 7,500 ft. Ending at day 9 to summit at 19,341 ft. This is a fully supported hike with Embark Exploration company.
