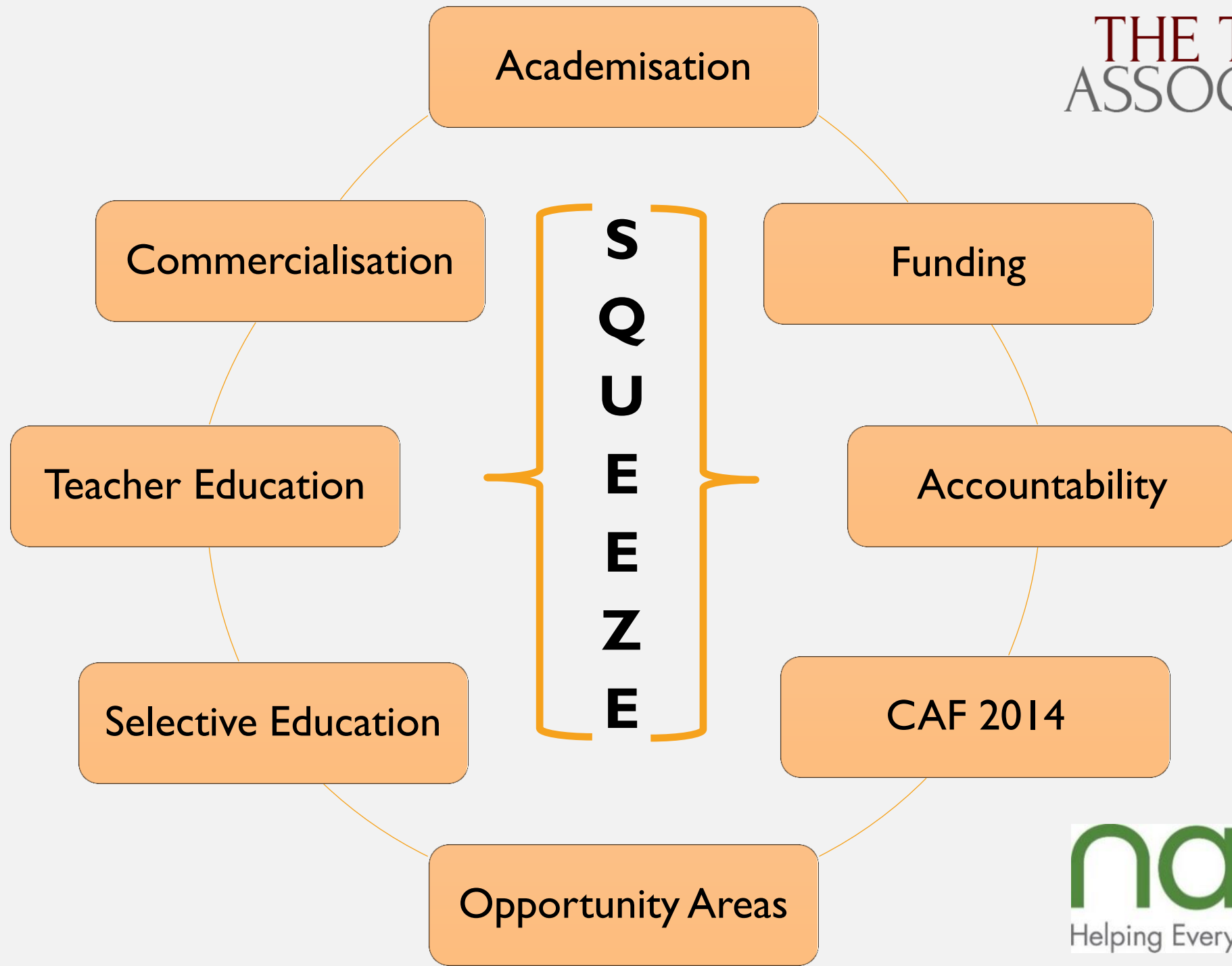

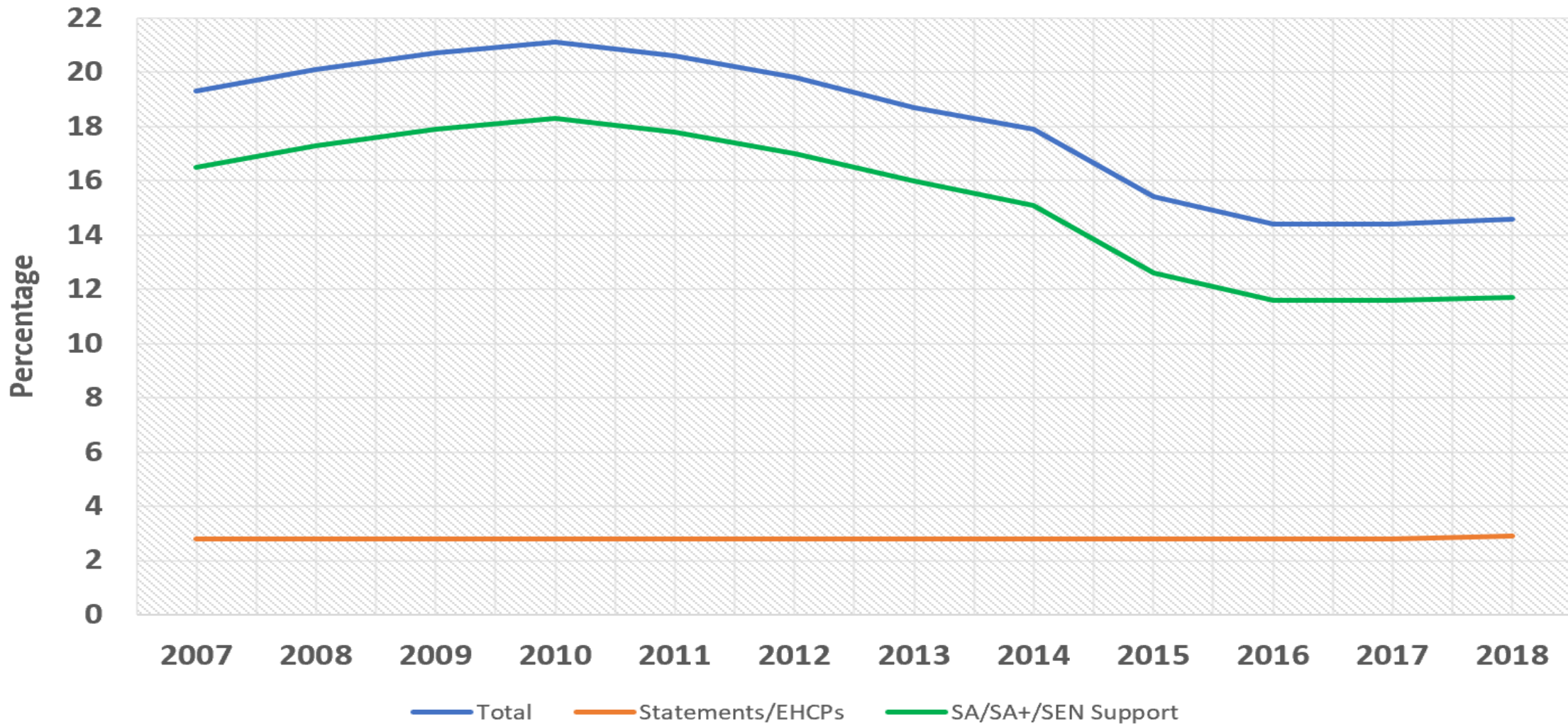

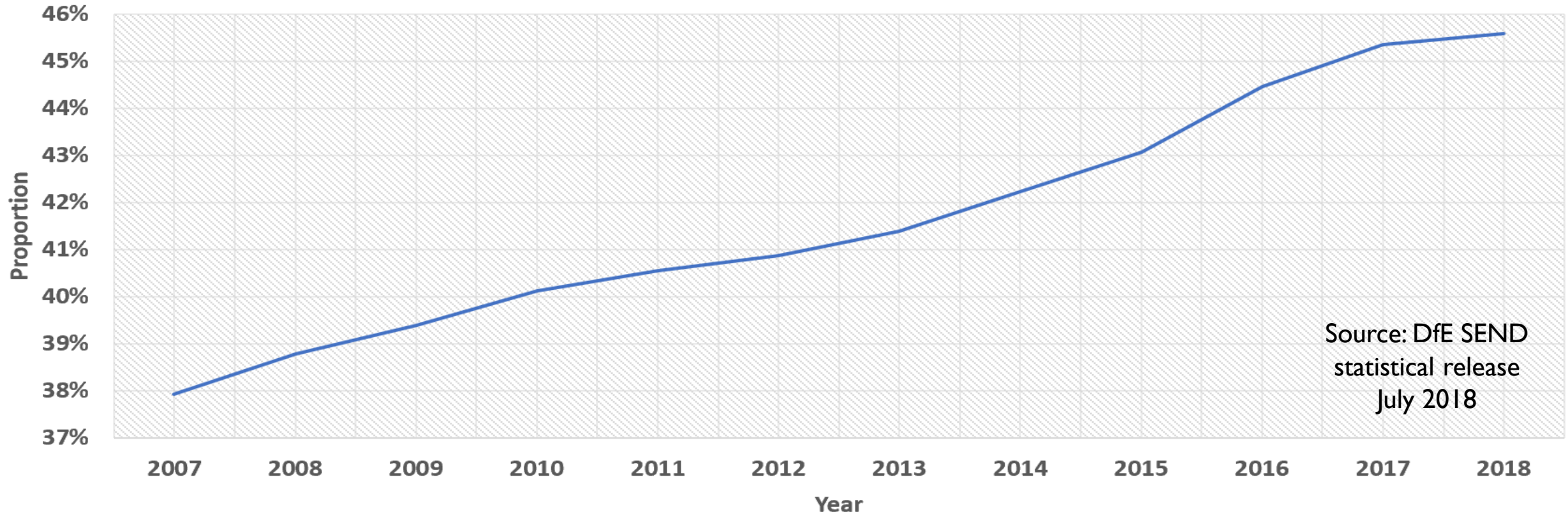


Proportion of children in England with SEND over time



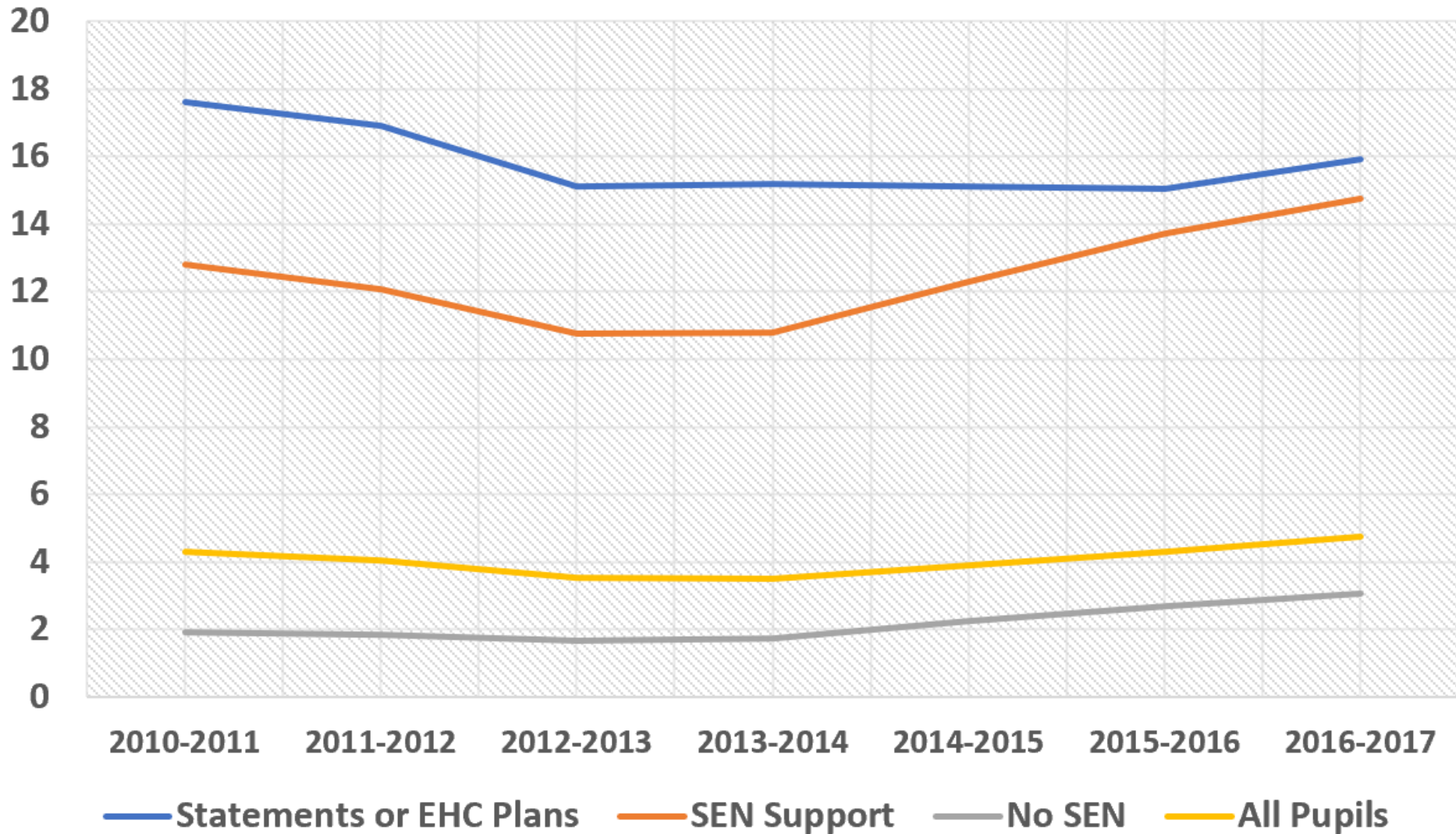

Proportion of Children with statements or EHC plans attending maintained or non-maintained special schools



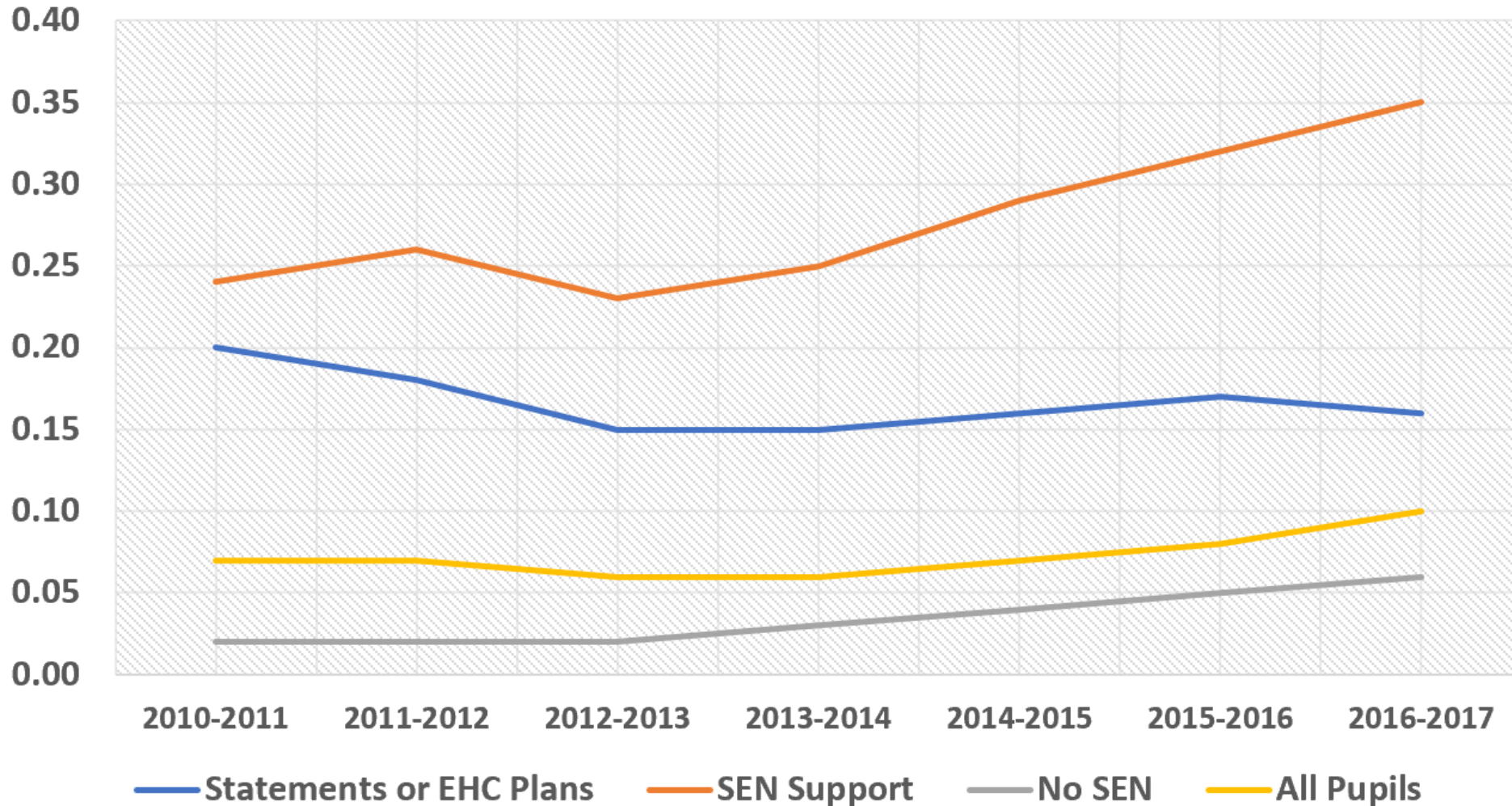

SEN Fixed Term Exclusions (%)

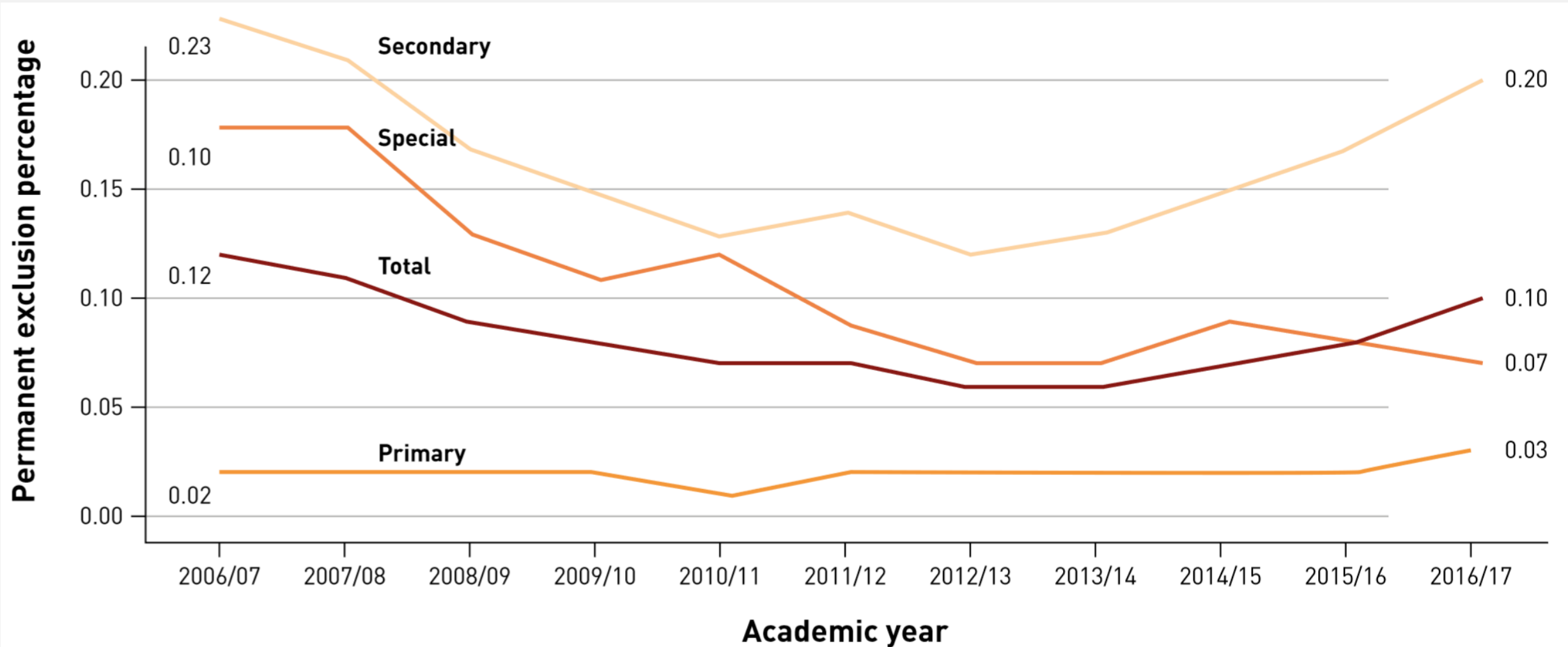

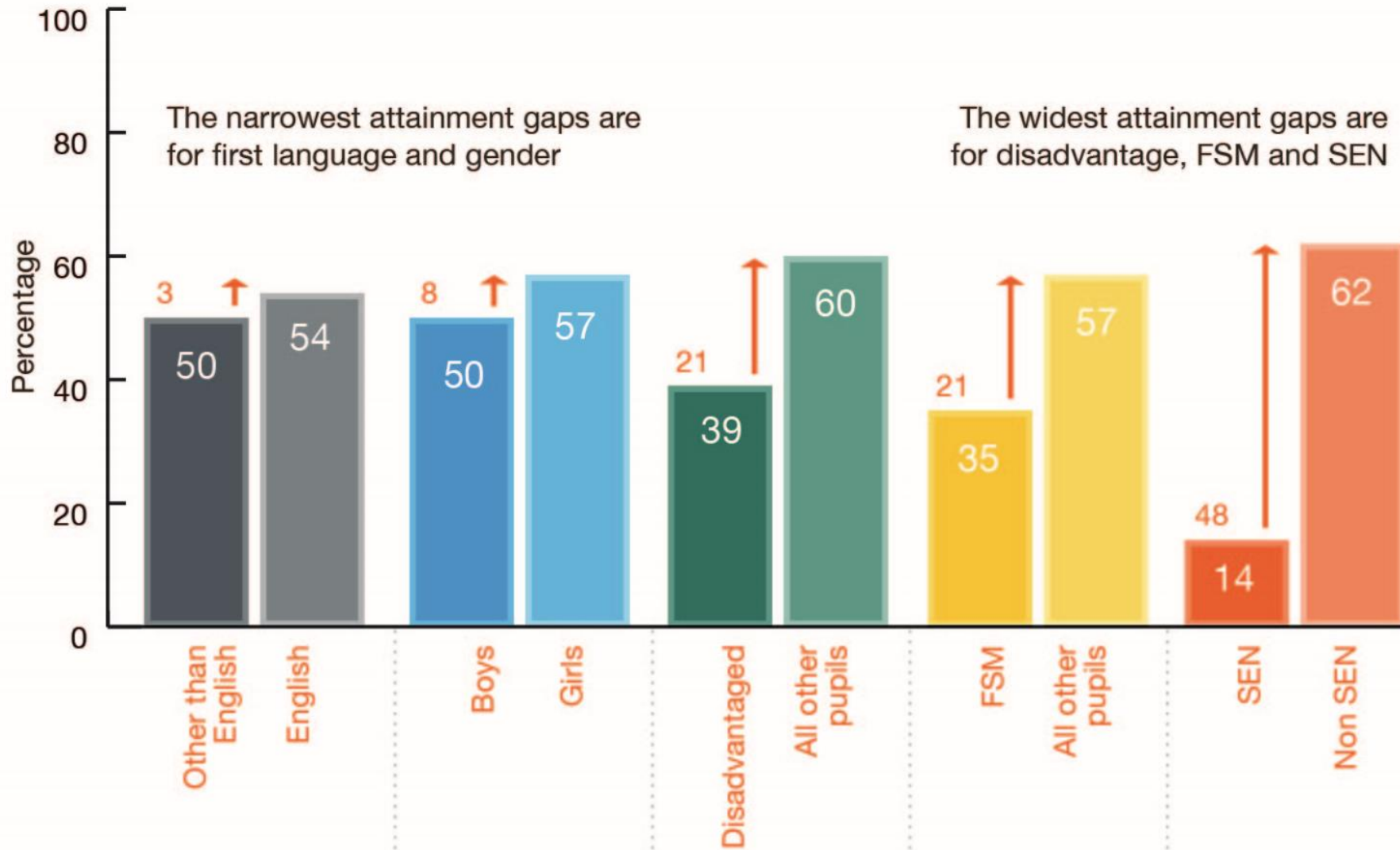
ACCOUNTABILITY AND ASSESSMENT

- E-Bacc: creating a narrowing of the curriculum. Is cultural inclusion an issue?
- Ofsted framework: shifting to focus on the curriculum...
- Progress 8: does it drive the right behaviours?
- Is there Life after Levels? Does it work for learners and their families?
- Age-Related Expectation: who is this average child?!
- Rochford Review: introduction of engagement scales and removal of P-levels
- Maths and English at primary level has become much harder. Is this for better or for worse?



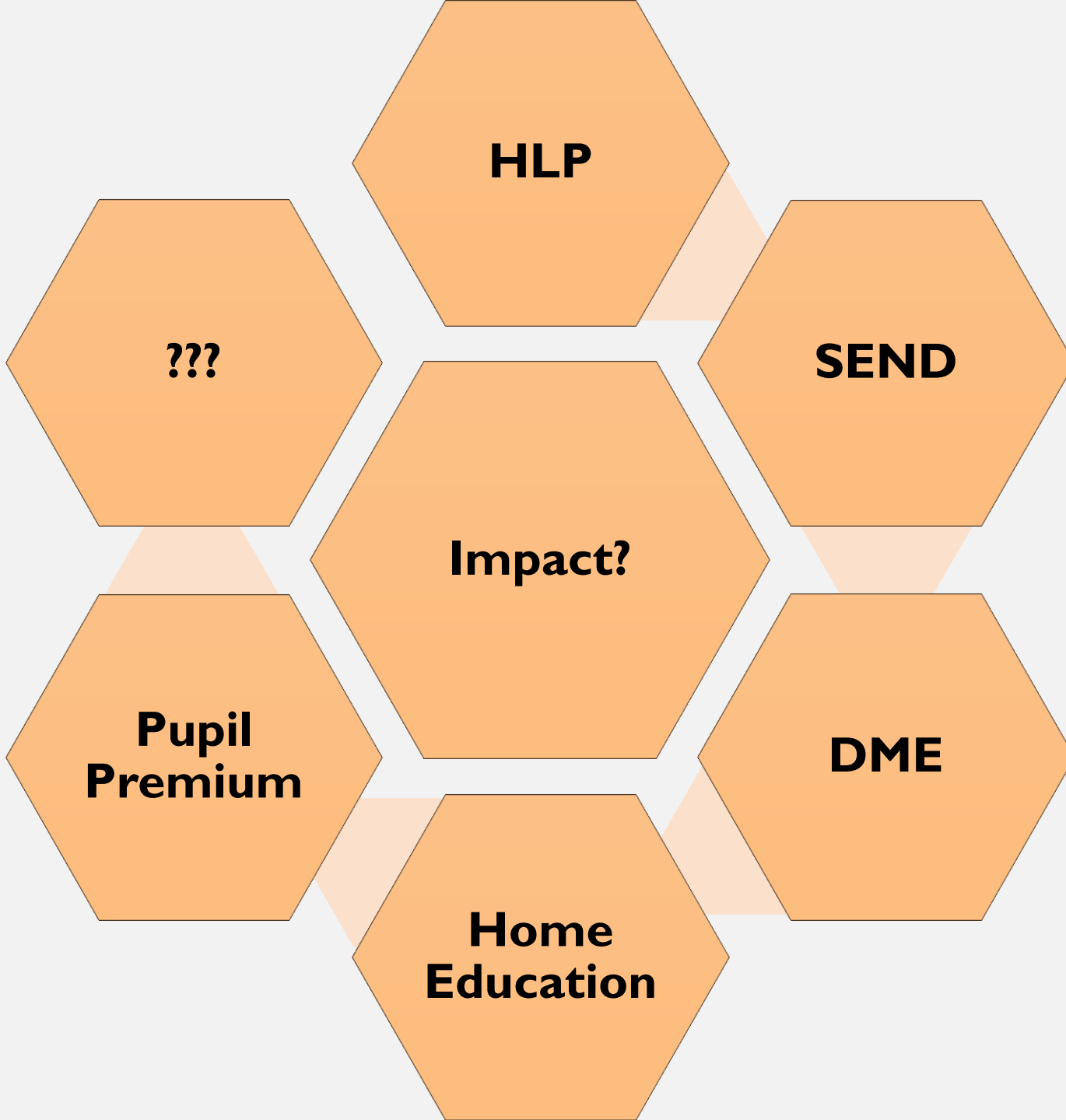
Attainment gap, age 11, by different pupil characteristics:

OPPORTUNITIES

- Education is becoming more flexible
- Greater openness to the use of technology for teaching
 - (e.g. online learning platforms, distance learning, ...)
- More scope for mixed approaches
 - (e.g. alternative provision with some private tuition, dual-rolling between specialist/mainstream provision, home-education groups formalising and obtaining private tuition for particular subjects)
- Opportunities for groups of tutors to set up free schools
