Week 2: **Reading Adventures.** Embark on thrilling reading adventures! Students will discover new books, participate in group readings, and enjoy interactive discussions that make reading fun and exciting. This week also features comprehension games and activities to promote a deeper understanding and love for reading.

Week 3: Creative Writing & Imagination. Week 3 is all about creativity and innovation in writing. Students will craft their own stories and bring their imaginations to life through fun activities and exercises. They will be introduced to story elements, participate in group storytelling games, create their own short stories, and explore poetry.

Important to Note

- Ensuring safety is our top priority at our learning center. For Grades K-12, our hours are from 8:30am to 5:50pm. Adult learners' classes begin promptly at 6pm and end at 8pm. To maintain separation and safety:
 - Students in Grades K-12 must be picked up before 6pm to allow for a smooth transition.
 - For any pick-ups after 6pm, a fee of \$15 will be charged. Students will be supervised by a staff member in the lobby until pick-up. Please ensure you are on the list of authorized pick-ups when registering. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation in maintaining a safe environment for all.
 - Adult learners, please arrive no earlier than 6pm. If you arrive early, kindly wait outside until a staff member
 escorts you in. This helps us manage transitions effectively and prioritize safety for all. Thank you for your
 cooperation and understanding.
 - All staff at Champions undergo thorough background checks to ensure the safety and well-being of our students.
 - All classrooms are equipped with 24-hour video surveillance, providing continuous monitoring to enhance safety and security.
 - Our workshops adhere to **strict sanitation procedures**, including regular cleaning and disinfection of shared spaces and equipment.
 - While masks are optional, we encourage participants to follow their own comfort level and <u>respect others'</u>
 <u>choices</u> regarding COVID-19 protocols.
 - If there is available space in our classrooms, we **encourage** parents to join our workshops or volunteer. In the event of limited space, a list will be provided to ensure all parents have the opportunity to participate.
- To provide each learner with personalized attention and a supportive learning environment, our classes are intentionally small and fill up on a first-come, first-served basis.
 - We limit our K-12 classrooms to just 8 students with up to 2 teachers
 - Our adult classrooms accommodate up to 14 participants with 2 teachers
 - A waitlist is created once a class is full. Participants on the waitlist will be contacted in order if a spot becomes available.
- Registration and payment must be completed online (or call or email us) to secure a spot in our workshops.
- If a participant needs to withdraw more than **7 days before** the workshop begins, a full refund will be issued. Withdrawals made within **7 days of the start date are subject to a 50% cancellation fee.**
- All supplies, resources, technology, smocks, safety equipment, etc. are included.
- No one will be admitted to computer workshops later than 10 minutes past the start time.
- This training is conducted on PC AND MAC computers.
- Please **do not** bring your laptops as we cannot offer assistance using them and the exercises used during the workshop cannot be loaded onto personal laptops. Each participant will have a PC or a MAC computer to work on during the workshop.
- Each person attending a workshop must have their own account. Multiple learners may not register under one
 account.
- For courses involving interaction with our friendly reptiles, fish, and other small mammals, please note that a waiver will need to be signed.
- We take pride in delivering high-quality education across all our courses. The majority of our classes are led by two teachers, ensuring personalized attention and support. And some of our classes also benefit from the expertise of certified professionals. For example, our teen entrepreneur courses feature visits from self-made millionaires who reside in Houston, and professional counselors offer guidance in our SEL classes.
 - In our adult programs, successful business professionals provide real-world insights. We always provide **a one-week notification** ahead of any guest presenter to enhance the learning experience.
- Champions Learning Center reserves the right to cancel a class for insufficient enrollment, weather emergencies, and other unforeseen circumstances. Should a cancellation occur, we will use the email you provided to contact you, and a refund will be issued 24 hours after a workshop is canceled.
- Preregistration is highly recommended. If an event is canceled or postponed and you have not preregistered, we
 will not be able to contact you.
- If you choose to register at the door, you will need your mobile device to complete your registration.
- Satisfactory meeting room temperatures are difficult to maintain. Always bring a sweater or jacket to ensure comfort.

FAQ's - Academic Summer Camp

- 1. Can my child attend only one week? Yes, you can choose any of the three weeks for your child to attend. Alternatively, if your child attends all three weeks, you will receive a \$10 discount.
- 2. My child will not be available during the camp dates, but I'm still interested in the curriculum. Is there another way for my child to learn it? Absolutely! We offer one-on-one tutoring at our center, online, or in your home. We are flexible with scheduling to ensure all children have the opportunity to receive a high-quality education.
- 3. Are there any prerequisites for attending the camp? No prerequisites are required. The camp is designed to accommodate students of all reading and writing levels, providing activities that cater to their individual needs and abilities.
- 4. **What is the student-to-teacher ratio?** We maintain a low student-to-teacher ratio (8 students max per classroom) to ensure each child receives personalized attention and support throughout the workshop.
- 5. What safety measures are in place? The safety and well-being of our learners are our top priorities. We follow all local health guidelines, including regular sanitation of the facilities and ensuring that all staff are trained in first aid and emergency procedures.
- 6. **Can parents visit the workshop during the sessions?** For security and space reasons, we limit visits during camp hours. However, we do invite parents to attend our end-of-week showcase, where students can share their work and experiences.
