General John Logan issued General Order 11 on 5 May 1868 declaring that 30 May be "designated for the purpose of strewing with flowers or otherwise decorating the graves of comrades who died in defense of their country...".

The date of 30 May was chosen because it was not the date of any Civil War battle. That officially began Decoration Day which, after a few world wars became Memorial Day.

Enjoy the Memorial Day holiday. Go to the beach, break out the grill or shop the sales but please take a moment to remember those who made these activities possible.

The National Board of Trustees has the fiduciary responsibility for the operation and budget requirements of the Marine Corps League. The last time fees were adjusted was 19 years ago. The National Board of Trustees voted and approved the following:

Effective 1 July 2023, the Life Membership Fees will increase as per the following chart:

\$1000.00 - 35 years of age and lower

\$ 800.00 - 36-50 years of age

\$ 600.00 – 51-64 years of age

\$ 400.00 - 65-84 years of age


\$ 100.00 - 85 years of age and higher





Free Entrance to National Parks

Explore the outdoors. You can use your <u>Veteran ID Card (VIC)</u> to gain free access to more than 2,000 federal recreation areas, including <u>national parks</u>, wildlife refuges, and forests. Gold Star Families and Veterans can <u>enjoy a variety of activities like camping</u>, hiking, biking, and much more.

Bunker Announcements:

- NO CHILDREN are allowed to sit at the bar. (For legal purposes, this means anyone under the age of 18, though the label may also apply to a few unnamed grunts). Minors must sit at tables or high tops only.
- **Guests are permitted 3 visits to The Bunker**. Upon the 3rd visit, they will be required to submit a membership application before returning.
- Non-members will be assessed an additional \$1.00 surcharge on drinks.
- When playing the dice, <u>3 of a kind gets a free drink</u> of the kind already purchased, <u>4 of a kind gets 2 free drinks</u> of the kind already purchased. Five of a kind receives the monetary amount based on the roll sequence.
- When you are going to use free drink chips to pay for your drinks, <u>let the bartender know</u> <u>before they tally your "cash out" on the computer</u>. If you produce the chips after they produce the "cash out" total, it causes issues. Be considerate of your volunteer bartenders and <u>TIP THEM WELL</u>.

If you have service connected disabilities and hold a VA Card indicating that, you can go to the Myakka State Park Rangers Office, off of State Road 72, and be issued a pass.




MISSION AND PURPOSE



Jack Lummus was a two sport star at Baylor, an all American in both football and baseball.

"The greatest athlete since Jim Thorpe" is how one newspaper described him.

As a rookie on the New York Giants, the two way player led them to the championship game against the Chicago Bears in 1941. Just weeks after the game, Jack was commissioned as a 2nd lieutenant in the Marine Corps. "Some things are more important than sports," he said at the time.

Jack Lummus was part of the initial wave of Marines at Iwo Jima, first serving as an artillery spotter before taking command of the 3rd Rifle Platoon for Company E. It was at the battle for Nishi Ridge where Lummus led his men against an entrenched Japanese line despite suffering a shoulder wound from shrapnel.

He would step on a land mine, blasting off his legs, but continued to encourage his men as he was carried away on a stretcher.

"Well, doc, the New York Giants lost a mighty good end today," were his last words.

Jack Lummus was posthumously awarded the Medal of Honor on May 30, 1946.

MARINE CORPS HISTORY IN MAY

- **2 May 1946:** Marines from Treasure Island Marine Barracks, under the command of Warrant Officer Charles L. Buckner, aided in suppressing the three-day prison riot at Alcatraz Penitentiary in San Francisco Bay. WO Buckner, a veteran of the Bougainville and Guam campaigns, ably led his force of Marines without suffering a single casualty.
- **5 May 1983:** In Beirut, Lebanon, a UH-1N helicopter carrying the commander of the American peace-keeping force, Colonel James Mead, was hit by machine gun fire. The six Marines aboard escaped injury. Colonel Mead and his crew had taken off in the helicopter to investigate artillery and rocket duels between rival Syrian-backed Druze Moslem militiamen and Christian Phalangists that endangered French members of the multinational force.
- **8 May 1995:** In the wake of the most devastating storm to hit the New Orleans area in more than 200 years, a group of Marines and sailors from Marine Forces Reserve demonstrated the quick response synonymous with the Navy/Marine Corps team. Within 24 hours of being called, Marines assisted in the evacuation of 2,500 civilians, and Navy corpsmen treated scores of flood victims. Marines of Marine Corps Detachment, Keesler Air Force Base in Biloxi Mississippi cleared debris in Gulfport Mississippi east of New Orleans.
- **10 May 1945:** The 22d Marines, 6th Marine Division, executed a pre-dawn attack south across the Asa River Estuary and seized a bridgehead from which to continue the attack toward Naha, the capital of Okinawa.
- **15 May 1862:** Corporal John Mackie, the first Marine to earn the Medal of Honor, was commended for service in the USS GALENA during action against Confederate shore batteries at Drewry's Bluff which blocked the James River approaches to Richmond.
- **16 May 1945:** The 22d and 29th Marines continued the attack against Half Moon Hill, a day characterized by the 6th Marine Division as the "bitterest" of the Okinawa campaign. By the 18th, the famed "Shuri line" had been broached.
- **22 May 1912:** First Lieutenant Alfred A. Cunningham, the first Marine officer to be assigned to "duty in connection with aviation" by Major General Commandant William P. Biddle, reported for aviation training at the Naval Aviation Camp at Annapolis, Maryland, and Marine aviation had its official beginning.
- **23 May 1988:** The V-22 Osprey, the world's first production tilt-rotor aircraft, made its debut during rollout ceremonies at Bell Helicopter Textron's Arlington, Texas, facility. More than 1,000 representatives from the military, industry, and media, gathered to hear various speakers, including Gen Alfred Gray, Commandant of the Marine Corps, praise the versatile rotor craft designed to meet the needs of 21st Century battlefields.
- **26 May 1969:** Operation Pipestone Canyon began when the 1st Battalion, 26th Marines and 3d Battalion, 5th Marines began sweeps in the Dodge City/Go Noi areas southwest of Da Nang. It terminated at the end of June with 610 enemy killed in action at a cost of 34 Marines killed.
- **29 May 1991:** Elements of a joint task force that included the 5th Marine Expeditionary Brigade departed the Bay of Bengal off the coast of Bangladesh after nearly two weeks of disaster relief operations following a devastating cyclone. The joint task force delivered tons of relief supplies using helicopters, C-130s, and landing craft in Operation Sea Angel.

SERGEANT WALTER K. SINGLETON

UNITED STATES MARINE CORPS

for service as set forth in the following CITATION:

"For conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity at the risk of his life above and beyond the call of duty while serving as Supply Sergeant, Company A, First Battalion, Ninth Marines, Third Marine Division on 24 March 1967. Sergeant Singleton's company was conducting combat operations in Gio Linh District, Quang Tri Province, Republic of Vietnam, when the lead platoon received intense small arms, automatic weapons, rocket, and mortar fire from a well entrenched enemy force. As the company fought its way forward, the extremely heavy enemy fire caused numerous friendly casualties. Sensing the need for early treatment of the wounded, Sergeant Singleton quickly moved from his relatively safe position in the rear of the foremost point of the advance and made numerous trips through the enemy killing zone to move the injured men out of the danger area. Noting that a large part of the enemy fire was coming from a hedgerow, he seized a machine gun and assaulted the key enemy location, delivering devastating fire as he advanced. He forced his way through the hedgerow directly into the enemy strong point. Although he was mortally wounded, his fearless attack killed eight of the enemy and drove the remainder from the hedgerow. Sergeant Singleton's bold actions completely disorganized the enemy defense and saved the lives of many of his comrades. His daring initiative, selfless devotion to duty and indomitable fighting spirit reflected great credit upon himself and the Marine Corps, and his performance upheld the highest traditions of the United States Naval Service."
