 your volunteer bartenders—and TIP THEM WELL!


Dice Game Rules





Life Membership Notice


Section 7050. Life Members. Effective 1 September 2021 the Life Membership fee shall be as established by the National Board of Trustees and shall be posted on the National Website.

The National Board of Trustees has the fiduciary responsibility for the operation and budget requirements of the Marine Corps League. The last time fees were adjusted was 19 years ago. The National Board of Trustees voted and approved the following:

Effective 1 July 2023, the Life Membership Fees will increase:

\$1000.00 - 35 years of age and lower

- \$ 800.00 36-50 years of age
- \$ 600.00 51-64 years of age
- \$ 400.00 65-84 years of age
- \$ 100.00 85 years of age and higher



Tricare Regions Changing 2025

FALLS CHURCH, Va. — Jan. 1, 2025, marks the start of health care delivery under TRICARE's new regional contracts. There will be changes to the TRICARE regions in the United States as part of the new contracts. While there will still be two TRICARE regions, six states currently in the East Region (Arkansas, Illinois, Louisiana, Oklahoma, Texas, Wisconsin) will move to the West Region. If you're located in one of the six states moving to the West Region, this article will help you understand what that will mean for you.

If you live in the current West Region, you'll need to take the actions discussed in this article, too. Your TRICARE contractor is also changing. If you don't live in one of these states, keep an eye out for upcoming articles about how the transition may impact you.

"These changes will help balance the TRICARE population between the two regions and improve the quality of service for all beneficiaries," said Laura D'Antin, team lead, Customer Support, TRICARE Health Plan, Education and Outreach Branch at the Defense Health Agency.

States switching regions

Six states are moving from the East Region to the West Region:

- Arkansas
- Illinois
- Louisiana
- Oklahoma
- Texas
- Wisconsin

If you live in one of these six states, your TRICARE regional contractor will switch from Humana Military to TriWest Healthcare Alliance on Jan. 1, 2025. This change will affect about 1.1 million eligible beneficiaries.

If your state is switching regions, Humana Military will continue as your TRICARE contractor until Dec. 31, 2024. Before then, you should check your DEERS account to confirm that all your information is up to date.

- Create an account on the TriWest patient portal.
- Update your payment information with TriWest. This will help make sure you can make your payments to TriWest (if applicable) starting Jan. 1, 2025. (Note: If you pay by allotment, you don't need to do this. Allotment payments will transfer automatically.)
- Search for providers in the new TriWest provider network directory. You'll find the directory on the patient portal.

You should also plan to take any actions for TRICARE Open Season through TriWest. Keeping your care on track If you have ongoing care, don't worry. If you live in these six states, referrals or authorizations from Humana Military that began before Dec. 31, 2024, will be valid through the referral expiration date, up to June 30, 2025. Additionally, TriWest will work with Humana Military to ensure you get care without disruption for the following conditions:

- Cancer
- Pregnancy
- Neurological disorders
- Mental health
- Kidney disease
- Disease management/case management services

February Marine Corps History

February is a month filled with pivotal moments in Marine Corps history, showcasing the courage, innovation, and determination that define our Corps.

February 16, 1804 – "To the Shores of Tripoli"

During the First Barbary War, **Lt. Stephen Decatur** led a daring raid in **Derna, Libya,** destroying the captured USS *Philadelphia* to prevent its use by enemy forces. This mission became one of the Marine Corps' first major expeditionary operations and inspired the famous line in the Marine Hymn: "To the Shores of Tripoli."

February 1912 – Birth of Marine Corps Aviation

The Marine Corps took to the skies when **1st Lt. Alfred A. Cunningham** reported for flight training, laying the foundation for what would become a vital aspect of Marine Corps operations.

February 1942 – First Black Marines Begin Training

Breaking racial barriers, the first African American Marines began training at **Montford Point**, North Carolina. These trailblazers paved the way for greater diversity in the Corps and earned their place in Marine Corps history.

February 17-22, 1944 – Battle of Eniwetok

Marines from the **22nd Marine Regiment** launched an assault on **Eniwetok Atoll** in the Pacific, securing a crucial foothold for further Allied operations against Japan during World War II.

February 19, 1945 – Battle of Iwo Jima Begins

One of the most iconic battles in Marine Corps history, the fight for Iwo Jima lasted **36 days**, with Marines overcoming fierce Japanese resistance to capture the island. On **February 23, 1945**, **five Marines and a Navy corpsman** raised the American flag atop **Mount Suribachi**, immortalized in one of the most famous images in history.

February 1951 – First Combat Helicopter Insertion

During the **Korean War, Marine Helicopter Squadron HMR-161** executed the first-ever combat helicopter insertion, revolutionizing battlefield mobility and shaping the future of modern warfare.

February 1968 – Battle of Hue City

As part of the **Tet Offensive**, Marines fought in brutal house-to-house combat to retake Hue City from North Vietnamese forces. This battle became a defining moment in Marine Corps history, demonstrating the grit and determination of the Corps.

February 1904 – Marines Land in the Dominican Republic

Marines deployed to the **Dominican Republic** to protect American interests and restore stability—one of many early examples of the Marine Corps' role in crisis response and security operations.

February reminds us of the legacy we carry forward—one of service, sacrifice, and unwavering resolve. **Semper Fi!**

Medal of Honor Spotlight



Pfc. James Anderson Jr.

Born: January 2, 1947

Died: February 28, 1967

Hometown: Compton, California



The President of the United States takes pride in presenting the MEDAL OF HONOR posthumously to

PFC JAMES ANDERSON JR. UNITED STATES MARINE CORPS

for service as set forth in the following CITATION:

For conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity at the risk of his life above and beyond the call of duty. Company F was advancing in dense jungle northwest of Cam Lo in an effort to extract a heavily besieged reconnaissance patrol. Pfc. Anderson's platoon was the lead element and had advanced only about 200 meters when they were brought under extremely intense enemy small-arms and automatic-weapons fire. The platoon reacted swiftly, getting on line as best they could in the thick terrain, and began returning fire. Pfc. Anderson found himself tightly bunched together with the other members of the platoon only 20 meters from the enemy positions. As the firefight continued several of the men were wounded by the deadly enemy assault. Suddenly, an enemy grenade landed in the midst of the marines and rolled alongside Pfc. Anderson's head. Unhesitatingly and with complete disregard for his personal safety, he reached out, grasped the grenade, pulled it to his chest and curled around it as it went off. Although several marines received shrapnel from the grenade, his body absorbed the major force of the explosion. In this singularly heroic act, Pfc. Anderson saved his comrades from serious injury and possible death. His personal heroism, extraordinary valor, and inspirational supreme self-sacrifice reflected great credit upon himself and the Marine Corps and upheld the highest traditions of the U.S. Naval Service. He gallantly gave his life for his country. /S/ RICHARD M. NIXON
