As with all productions, this has been a team effort. Huge thanks to everyone involved both on and off stage. 

Robin Hood: the myth, the man, the legend

There have been many stories and films about Robin Hood and his band of Merry Men. Most are based in Nottinghamshire, sharing the story of him stealing from the rich to give to the poor.

Where was Robin Hood from?

Robin Hood is a legend in Nottinghamshire. His legacy lives all over the county, with links to Sherwood Forest, the Major Oak, Nottingham Castle and other landmarks.

There have been many different stories of Robin Hood and it can be difficult to decide which is the most accurate, but legend has it that this outlaw also travelled throughout Lincolnshire and Yorkshire with his band of merry men.

The Sheriff of Nottingham

The Sheriff of Nottingham plays a key part in the legend of Robin Hood. Robin Hood was very loyal to the King of England at the time, King Richard I. But when the King went overseas to battle in the crusades, he left the Sheriff in charge of protecting the land and royal deer of Nottinghamshire.

The Sheriff of Nottingham was known to be a mean man, who raised taxes, promising people that he would make Nottingham a better place to live. However, it's thought he used the money raised to fuel his own extravagance and ego. As the tax prices increased and people could no longer afford to pay the higher rates, he made them homeless.



Robin and His Merry Men

Robin did not agree with the tax raise the Sheriff introduced and began to take matters into his own hands. A fine archer, he, along with a few of his friends, decided they would help out those in need by stealing from the rich to give to the poor. It's no surprise that Robin made a fair number of enemies with this approach. But equally, he made many friends and allies.

- Friar Tuck was one of the Merry Men. As a man of the church, he handed out the money Robin acquired to the poor in his parish.
- Little John, a tall strong man who was a great fighter, became a close friend and ally to Robin and helped him out of quite a lot of trouble. Little John appears in all of the Robin Hood tales.
- Much the Miller's son was an outlaw before he met up with Robin, having been caught poaching deer on the Sheriff's land.
- Will Scarlet, known to be an excellent marksman, is thought to be a distant relative of Robin, possibly his cousin. His grave can still be found in a church in Blidworth, North Nottinghamshire.
- Allan A Dale was a travelling minstrel who entertained the men with his music. He joined the group after Robin rescued Allan's sweetheart from marrying an old, unpleasant knight.


