380 FPS with usually a 400 grain arrow-point combination but Barnett may have went to a 380? as they have with newer models. Axle to axle uncocked is 18.88" (slightly under 19"). I did not find the axle to axle cocked measurement but on average it is 3 1/2" to 4" narrower. Cross bow shoots 20" arrows with 1/2 moon nocks which are easy to find.



A high quality arrow I recommend is the 20" Blood Sport Witness which average 425 grain with a 100 grain point. These arrows are classed as weight forward where they have a 95 grain brass insert. The 22" weigh the same but have a 77 grain brass insert. These arrows are manufactured in China originally for Plano Synergy. They are available at some Wal Marts, eBay and Amazon. If the crossbow is properly tuned, using a good rest, a level bubble on the scope or picatinny rail and no wind, the Blood Sport Witness arrows are very accurate. As per 60x customs string site: string is 34 3/4", cables are 20 13/16" priced at \$109.95 a set. A couple of suggestions: 1)remove the cable slide or Teflon strip which ever this cross bow uses as they tend to chew up cables. Serve the cables in that area with BCY .030 serving which is high quality. It can be purchased from 60X. 2)Get rid of the wax and use Trident Silicone Grease and lightly lube the bowstring, cables, serving and a light coat on the rail. This is a high quality product that does not gum up or dry out but stays moist.



A wee bit goes a long way. Shooting 8 shots before retrieving my arrows I usually lube every 8 or 16 shots. This product is available on the internet. A wee dab of Gorilla Glue applied at the ends of all the servings is an added insurance against serving separation. This crossbow has a good quality riser which is a huge improvement over Barnett's Carbonite riser that was used on the Ghost series. Wishing you all the best. Take care. Can string stops be put on this model Look on the riser side of the bow string on the side of the rail to see if there are any predrilled and tapped holes. If not, one would have to drill a minimum of two holes per side and either tap the holes or use sheet metal screws. The reason I say a minimum of two holes is some string stop rubber brackets require four holes.



Two are for the screws and the other two are for round protrusions from the string stop bracket that fits into two holes. Try to find a set that is adjustable which personally I require when properly tuning a crossbow. I will not use those that are non adjustable. Replacing the bowstring and or cables, which may be a different length from what is being removed or adding 1/2 or full twists to what one has can change the spacing between the bowstring and the rubber stops. I always want a small gap between the uncocked bowstring and the rubber stops for the reason if no gap, when the crossbow is shot, the bowstring comes down like running into a wall. use Trident Silicone Grease and lightly lube the bowstring, cables, serving and a light coat on the rail. This is a high quality product that does not gum up or dry out but stays moist. A wee bit goes a long way. Shooting 8 shots before retrieving my arrows I usually lube every 8 or 16 shots. This product is available on the internet. on some of my crossbows that were manufactured over seas. This style is none adjustable. Here is an adjustable set that lists as "String Dampening System" found on the internet. This system fits in the cable groove and may require a bit of filing if the groove is a bit narrow. One can purchase individual 3/8" inner diameter rubbers on the internet as replacements. Set screws will allow one to turn the threaded section in or out. When doing this, make sure the set screw goes against the flat area of the threaded rod to prevent damage to the threads. The picture shows 4 rods which is only for clarity. One gets the main top bracket assembly and the two small brackets which may not be required depending on the style of crossbow the system is to be mounted to. Where the rubbers go onto the rods, if too long, one can remove the rubber and cut the rod shorter, then take electrical tape and put one layer on proper and then with out cutting the tape, flip it over and put a layer on in reverse (sticky side out) This will keep the rubbers from coming off because one has cut off the knurled area of the rod where the rubbers fit when shortening it. These are imported so the reason they are so cheap over here. A high quality crossbow is the Center Point Sniper XT390 for \$329.99 on Cabela's .com website. The only thing, this series does not come with arrows. High quality arrows is the 20" Blood Sport Witness that may be available at some Wal Marts, eBay and Amazon. I am shooting this crossbow with these arrows and could not wish for a better more accurate combination. It puts my other crossbows brands and series to shame. Wishing you all the best. Take care. Another crossbow company I was dealing with, a set of limbs listed for approximately \$120 U.S before any taxes or shipping. Bring that into Canada I was looking at slightly over \$200 Canadian. This was for the rebranded Rocky Mountain 405 and 415 series. The problem with this brand are limb failures where they will either sliver or break. Wishing you all the best. Take care.
