## **HOUSE REPUBLICANS AND FRIENDS ACROSS NEW HAMPSHIRE,**

Well, folks, here we go again. A foreign corporation with an operation in Kentucky, Gordon-Darby, has decided to sue the State of New Hampshire in federal court. Not a New Hampshire court. Not even a conversation with the people's elected representatives. No, they went straight to an unaccountable federal judge to try to overturn the will of the people and keep their little sticker racket alive.

Let this soak in for a minute: an out-of-state contractor which is a subsidiary of a European corporation, whose entire business model depends on shaking down Granite Staters for annual tribute, is now weaponizing the federal judiciary to override a law passed by your elected representatives and signed by your Governor. This is exactly the kind of big-government overreach that brought many of us to the Live Free or Die state in the first place.

I was just getting my oil changed this morning and the attendant asked me if I wanted a state inspection sticker. I said: "Don't you dare."

You have my word—we are already taking steps to protect you from this activist judge's injunction. The Live Free and Drive Amendment will ensure that failure to comply with the Sticker Scheme is classified as a non-moving secondary offense, removing law enforcement's ability to pull you over; drivers cannot be denied insurance or ascribed fault for failing to comply; and the penalty is set at one dollar. Gordon-Darby can have their injunction. Granite Staters will have their freedom in

the end.

The 2026 session has plenty more where that came from. Here's what's on the menu:

Made in New Hampshire, Stays in New Hampshire: We're pushing legislation to exempt firearms and firearm accessories manufactured and retained entirely within our borders from federal regulation under the Commerce Clause. If a rifle is made in New Hampshire by Granite Staters for Granite Staters, Washington has no business regulating it. The Second Amendment and the Tenth Amendment say so. Mark it "For N.H. Use Only"—and the feds can pound sand.

Universal Open Enrollment for Public Schools: The Senate just passed legislation that will finally allow parents to enroll their children in any public school in the state. For too long, your child's educational opportunities have been determined by your zip code. That ends now. Democrats are crying that the sky is falling—they always do when we empower parents instead of bureaucrats. But here's the truth: the only people who should decide where your child goes to school are you and your family, not some administrator protecting their turf.

# LIVE FREE AND DRIVE!

House Majority Leader Jason Osborne (R-Auburn) released the following statement after a federal judge sided with a corporate entity to subvert the will of the people and the State Legislature to reinstate mandatory vehicle inspections in New Hampshire.

“It is disappointing but not surprising to see unaccountable federal judges side with self-interested out-of-state contractors to spit in the face of Granite Staters and New Hampshire State Law,” said Osborne. “House Republicans will not give up on freeing you from the burdensome inspection mandate, and that’s why today we’re proposing the Live Free and Drive Amendment.”

*The Live Free and Drive Amendment ensures that:*


*Failure to comply with the Sticker Scheme will be classified as a non-moving secondary offense, removing law enforcement’s ability to pull over drivers.*

*Drivers cannot be denied insurance or ascribed fault for failure to comply with the Sticker Scheme.*

*The penalty for failing to comply with the Sticker scheme shall be set at one dollar.*



**DEMOCRATS PRAISE ILLEGAL ALIENS, BUT SPIT IN FACE OF LAW ENFORCEMENT**



Deputy House Majority Leader Joe Sweeney (R-Salem) released the following statement after House Democratic Leader Alexis Simpson (D-Exeter) introduced a bill meant to put federal immigration officials at risk.

**Step 1:** Go online to GC.NH.gov A picture of the State House dome will appear. Scroll down.

**Step 2:** When you see the box that says “Calendars & Meeting Schedules” click House Calendar (PDF). When you click “View PDF File” you will see a

copy of the House Calendar. When you scroll through the document, you will see a day-by-day list of the bills that are being held in each committee.

**Step 3:** When you find bills of interest, go back to Gencourt.State.NH.US. To read a bill, scroll down to the box on the left hand side of the screen that says “Current Bills” enter the bill number (Example: HB2, HB136 etc.) and click the magnifying glass.

**Step 4:** When you find the bill that you are looking for, click the bill number in the left hand corner. This will bring you to the bill docket. To read the bill and its amendments, click the version of the bill that you want to read in the box on the left-hand corner.

**Step 5:** Go back to Gencourt.state.nh.us. And scroll down to “Meeting Resources.” To register your opinion on the bill, click the option “House Sign-in Form and Online Testimony Submission.”
