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BOYS AND GIRLS CLUBS OF AMERICA

The Boys and Girls Clubs of America (BGCA) is a nationwide organization that began in 1860 with three women in Hartford, Connecticut. They organized the first Club "believing that boys who roamed the streets should have a positive alternate". With character as the cornerstone of the experience, the Club focused on capturing boys interests, improving their behavior and increasing their personal expectations and goals.

Today, Boys and Girls Clubs serve around 3.6 million young people in a typical year, 1.7 million through membership and 1.9 million through community outreach in nearly 5,000 facilities.

BGCA combats issues (homelessness, hunger, poverty, etc.) by empowering America's youth through education, leadership development, community involvement, health and wellness, and career readiness.

Method

BGCA supports local Boys and Girls Clubs to provide a fun, safe, inclusive, affordable, and constructive environment for children and teens during out-of-school hours. Clubs serve small towns, large metropolitan areas, public housing communities, Native populations, and U.S. military installations worldwide. Programs within the clubs are tailored to the local community and customized for each age group.

- classrooms (programming items to be donated before the start of the Club and throughout operation)

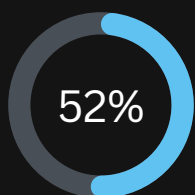
WHY BOYS AND GIRLS CLUB FOR OUR COMMUNITY?

Only **36%** of kindergarteners in Pulaski County are ready to learn (as of 2021-2022 school year), which is lower than the 44% state average.

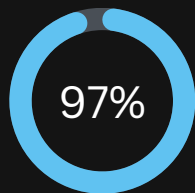
26.5% of children in Pulaski County live in poverty, as of 2020.

49% of children in Pulaski County live in low-income families (according to 2016-2020 data).

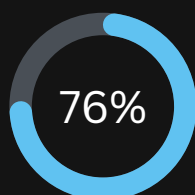
1 Developing globally competitive graduates



52% of 12th Grade Club members express interest in a STEM career, compared with 27% of 12th graders nationally.



97% of Club teens expect to graduate from high school.



76% of low-income Club members ages 12 to 18 who attend the Club regularly reported receiving mostly As and Bs, compared to the 67% of their peers nationally.

7.8 per 1,000 children ages 10-17 are incarcerated in the juvenile justice system in Pulaski County (according to 2019-2021 data).

83.3 per 1,000 children ages 10-17 in Pulaski County are in foster care (according to 2019-2021 data).

Only **45%** of children in Pulaski County exit foster care to reunification (according to 2019-2021 data).

75% of regularly attending members said they volunteered in their community, Club, school, or neighborhood at least once in the past year, with 41% volunteering at least once per month



87% of Club youth said they can stand up for what's right.

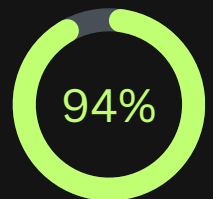
19.8% of children in Pulaski County live in food insecure households as of 2020, which is higher than the 16.1% state average.

31.8 teen births per 1,000 females ages 15-19 in Pulaski County (according to 2018-2020 data), which is higher than the state rate of 24.5 per 1,000 females ages 15-19.

9.5% of babies in Pulaski County are considered low-birthweight babies (according to 2018-2020 data), which is higher than the 8.7% state average.

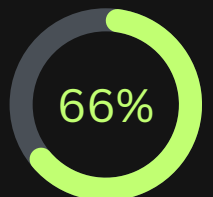
94% of Club members said there are many things they can do well.



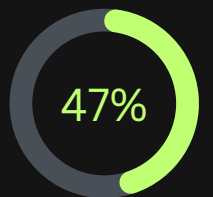
80% of Club youth said they understand how their feelings influence how they act.



66% of ninth grade Club boys report they exercise daily, compared with the 58% of ninth grade boys nationally.



47% of ninth grade Club girls report they exercise daily, compared with the 42% of ninth grade girls nationally.



WHAT WILL YOU HELP FUND?

SERVICE PROVIDED:	WHAT WE NEED:
A safe, inclusive, and educational out-of-school space that promotes active healthy learning and wellness	• Meal vouchers or coupons for out-of-school meals and snack packs • Computers and/or tablets and headphones for tutoring services, financial literacy courses, and digital literacy training • Sports training equipment, art supplies, extracurricular resources • Furniture and cleaning supplies for the facility • Targeted programming expenditures (ex. English textbooks for out-of-school tutoring)
Field trips throughout Pulaski County and Kentucky that enrich our students' working knowledge of opportunities and cultures in the communities around us	• Meal vouchers for restaurants and grocery stores (as needed) • Transportation or funding for transportation services to and from field trip destinations • Admission tickets to field trip destinations (as needed)
Hands-on, active experiences within and for the community	• Funding to start and maintain a community garden • Transportation or funding for transportation services to and from community service activities • Supplies for fundraising opportunities in the community for students (ex. donut sales, car wash, etc.)

Community Closet for students that may not have the resources to afford new clothing	• Clothes (especially coats and jackets) • Shoes • Backpacks
Boys & Girls Club Pantry to provide food for students that may be unable to access meals and food outside of the Club and schools	• Meal vouchers • Grocery coupons and gift cards • Food items to stock in the pantry
Wellness Wardrobe to provide health products (toothbrushes, menstruation products, tissues, etc.) and health/wellness information pamphlets provided (healthy eating guides, exercise and activity guides, etc.)	• Dental health products (toothbrushes, toothpaste, mouthwash, floss, etc.) • Hygiene products (shampoo, conditioner, body wash, soap, etc.) • Laundry products (detergent, dryer sheets, etc.)

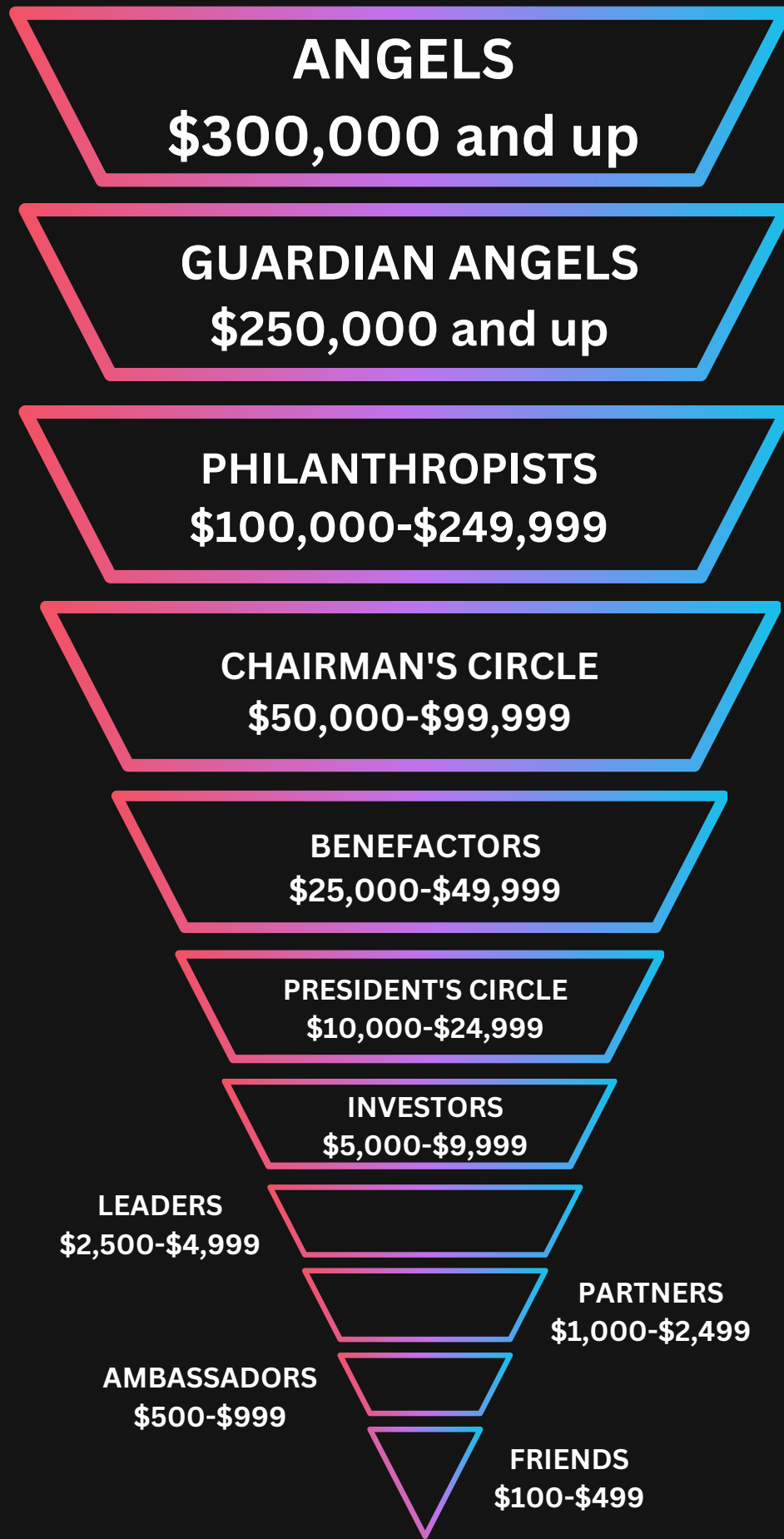
